The purpose of the resurrected life. **6:10**

Guidance to living the new life. 6:9–14

Maintain conviction of the Spiritual truth. 6:9–11

Four deterrents to this conviction.

Poor teaching. Emphasizing changed position without mention of changed nature.

Powerful enemy. Rob the believer of joy

Maintain the deceived in a state of deception.

Physical limitation.

Perpetual battle. Sin desires strongly to take over 1 Peter 2:11
