Exodus 12:1 (KJV)

¹ And the LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,

Exodus 12:1 (TEV)

¹ The LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in Egypt:

Exodus 12:1 (NIV)

¹ The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in Egypt,

Exodus 12:2 (KJV)

² This month *shall be* unto you the beginning of months: it *shall be* the first month of the year to you.

Exodus 12:2 (TEV)

² "This month is to be the first month of the year for you.

Exodus 12:2 (NIV)

² "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year.

Exodus 12:3 (KJV)

³ Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth *day* of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of *their* fathers, a lamb for an house:

Exodus 12:3 (TEV)

³ Give these instructions to the whole community of Israel: On the tenth day of this month each man must choose either a lamb or a young goat for his household.

Exodus 12:3 (NIV)

³ Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household.

Exodus 12:4 (KJV)

⁴ And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next unto his house take *it* according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb.

Exodus 12:4 (TEV)

⁴ If his family is too small to eat a whole animal, he and his next-door neighbor may share an animal, in proportion to the number of people and the amount that each person can eat.

Exodus 12:4 (NIV)

⁴ If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are. You are to determine the amount of lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat.

Exodus 12:5 (KJV)

⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take *it* out from the sheep, or from the goats:

Exodus 12:5 (TEV)

⁵ You may choose either a sheep or a goat, but it must be a one-year-old male without any defects.

Exodus 12:5 (NIV)

⁵ The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (KJV)

¹ Thou shalt not sacrifice unto the LORD thy God *any* bullock, or sheep, wherein is blemish, *or* any evilfavouredness: for that *is* an abomination unto the LORD thy God.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (TEV)

¹ "Do not sacrifice to the LORD your God cattle or sheep that have any defects; the LORD hates this.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (NIV)

¹ Do not sacrifice to the LORD your God an ox or a sheep that has any defect or flaw in it, for that would be detestable to him.

And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.

¹³ The blood on the doorposts will be a sign to mark the houses in which you live. When I see the blood, I will pass over you and will not harm you when I punish the Egyptians.

Exodus 12:13 (NIV)

¹³ The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt.

Just as the plagues were a sign to Egypt of God's justice and judgment, now the Passover was a sign of God's mercy to Israel!

Exodus 12:21 (KJV)

²¹ Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel, and said unto them, Draw out and take you a lamb according to your families, and kill the passover.

Exodus 12:21 (TEV)

Moses called for all the leaders of Israel and said to them, "Each of you is to choose a lamb or a young goat and kill it, so that your families can celebrate Passover.

Exodus 12:21 (NIV)

Then Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go at once and select the animals for your families and slaughter the Passover lamb.

Exodus 12:22 (KJV)

And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip *it* in the blood that *is* in the bason, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that *is* in the bason; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning.

Exodus 12:22 (TEV)

Take a sprig of hyssop, dip it in the bowl containing the animal's blood, and wipe the blood on the doorposts and the beam above the door of your house. Not one of you is to leave the house until morning.

Exodus 12:22 (NIV)

Take a bunch of hyssop, dip it into the blood in the basin and put some of the blood on the top and on both sides of the doorframe. Not one of you shall go out the door of his house until morning.

Exodus 12:23 (KJV)

For the LORD will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the LORD will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite *you*.

Exodus 12:23 (TEV)

When the LORD goes through Egypt to kill the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the beams and the doorposts and will not let the Angel of Death enter your houses and kill you.

Exodus 12:23 (NIV)

When the LORD goes through the land to strike down the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the top and sides of the doorframe and will pass over that doorway, and he will not permit the destroyer to enter your houses and strike you down.

 It involved a sacrificial lamb Verses 3-6
 Its sign was blood Verse 7
 It was observed together Verse 6
 It was personal
