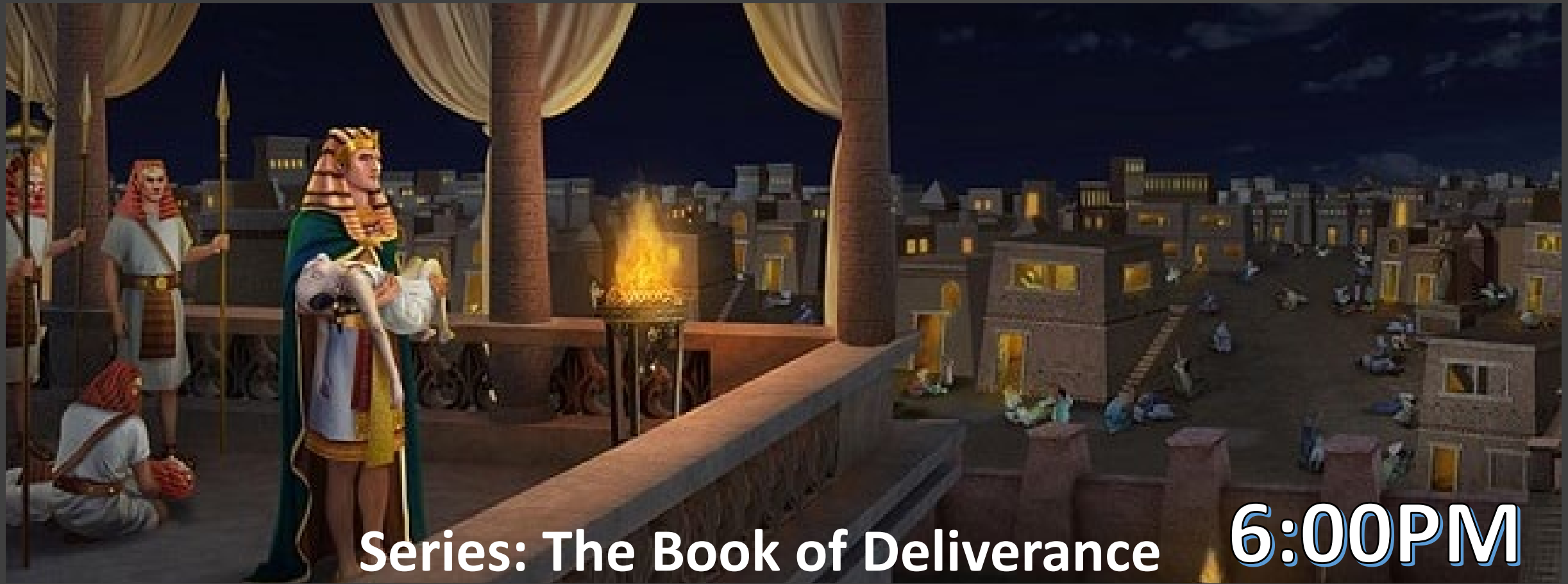

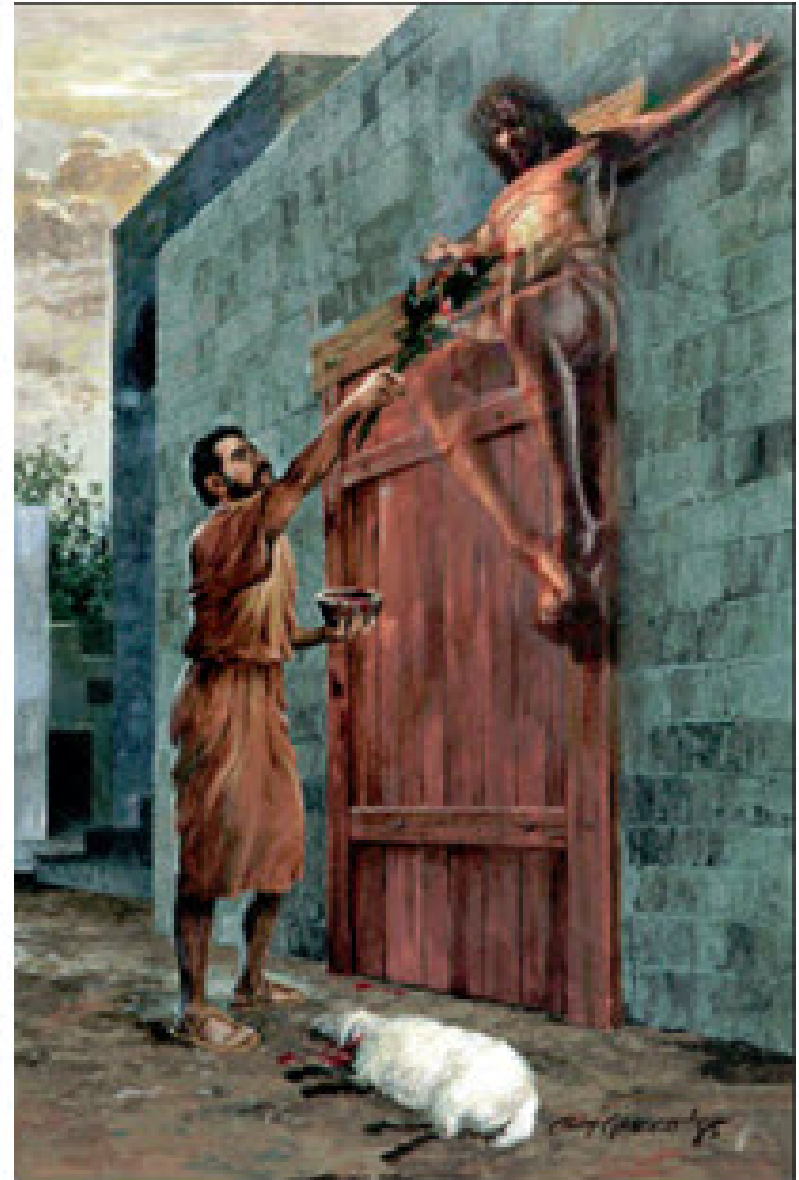

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:1 (KJV)

¹ And the LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,

Exodus 12:1 (TEV)

¹ The LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in Egypt:

¹ The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in Egypt,

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:2 (KJV)

² This month *shall be* unto you the beginning of months: it *shall be* the first month of the year to you.

Exodus 12:2 (TEV)

² "This month is to be the first month of the year for you.

Exodus 12:2 (NIV)

² "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:3 (KJV)

³ Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth *day* of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of *their* fathers, a lamb for an house:

Exodus 12:3 (TEV)

³ Give these instructions to the whole community of Israel: On the tenth day of this month each man must choose either a lamb or a young goat for his household.

Exodus 12:3 (NIV)

³ Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:4 (KJV)

⁴ And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next unto his house take *it* according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb.

Exodus 12:4 (TEV)

⁴ If his family is too small to eat a whole animal, he and his next-door neighbor may share an animal, in proportion to the number of people and the amount that each person can eat.

Exodus 12:4 (NIV)

⁴ If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are. You are to determine the amount of lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:5 (KJV)

⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take *it* out from the sheep, or from the goats:

Exodus 12:5 (TEV)

⁵ You may choose either a sheep or a goat, but it must be a one-year-old male without any defects.

Exodus 12:5 (NIV)

⁵ The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (KJV)

¹ Thou shalt not sacrifice unto the LORD thy God *any* bullock, or sheep, wherein is blemish, *or* any evilfavouredness: for that *is* an abomination unto the LORD thy God.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (TEV)

¹ "Do not sacrifice to the LORD your God cattle or sheep that have any defects; the LORD hates this.

Deuteronomy 17:1 (NIV)

¹ Do not sacrifice to the LORD your God an ox or a sheep that has any defect or flaw in it, for that would be detestable to him.

⁶ And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.

⁷ Then they are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses where they eat the lambs.

Exodus 12:8 (KJV)

⁸ And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread: *and with bitter herbs* they shall eat it.

⁸ That night they are to eat the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast.

Exodus 12:8 (NIV)

⁸ That same night they are to eat the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast.

Exodus 12:9 (KJV)

⁹ Eat not of it raw, nor sodden at all with water, but roast *with* fire; his head with his legs, and with the purtenance thereof.

Exodus 12:10 (KJV)

¹⁰ And ye shall let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remaineth of it until the morning ye shall burn with fire.

¹⁰ Do not leave any of it till morning; if some is left till morning, you must burn it.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:11 (KJV)

¹¹ And thus shall ye eat it; *with* your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it *is* the LORD'S passover.

Exodus 12:11 (TLV)

¹¹ You are to eat it with your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand. This is the Festival to honor the LORD.

Exodus 12:11 (NIV)

¹¹ This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt, your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste; it is the LORD's Passover.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:12 (KJV)

¹² For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt: and I will smite the land of Egypt, and will bring out the people of Israel from the land of Egypt. I will be a father to the fatherless, and a husband to the widow.

A transition to the Lord's response to the blood that is placed on the doorposts (vv. 12-13).

Exodus 12

¹² "On that night I will go through the land of Egypt, killing every first-born male, both human and animal, and punishing all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD.

Exodus 12:12 (NIV)

¹² "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn--both men and animals--and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD.

The Lord's Instructions to Moses

Exodus 12:13 (KJV)

¹³ And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye *are*: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and will not destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.

A transition to the Lord's response to the blood that is placed on the doorposts (vv. 12-13).

Exodus 12

¹³ The blood on the doorposts will be a sign to mark the houses in which you live. When I see the blood, I will pass over you and will not harm you when I punish the Egyptians.

Exodus 12:13 (NIV)

¹³ The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt.

Genesis 3:15 (KJV)

15 And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; he shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

In accomplishing this, He said,

"when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No plague will be among you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt."

Genesis

15 I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.

Genesis 3:15 (NIV)

15 And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Exodus 12:21 (KJV)

²¹ Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel, and said unto them, Draw out and take you a lamb according to your families, and kill the passover.

Exodus 12:21 (TEV)

²¹ Moses called for all the leaders of Israel and said to them, "Each of you is to choose a lamb or a young goat and kill it, so that your families can celebrate Passover.

Exodus 12:21 (NIV)

²¹ Then Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go at once and select the animals for your families and slaughter the Passover lamb.

Moses Relayed the Instructions to the Elders.

Exodus 12:22 (KJV)

²² And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip *it* in the blood that *is* in the bason, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that *is* in the bason; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning.

Exodus 12:22 (TEV)

²² Take a sprig of hyssop, dip it in the bowl containing the animal's blood, and wipe the blood on the doorposts and the beam above the door of your house. Not one of you is to leave the house until morning.

Exodus 12:22 (NIV)

²² Take a bunch of hyssop, dip it into the blood in the basin and put some of the blood on the top and on both sides of the doorframe. Not one of you shall go out the door of his house until morning.

Moses Relayed the Instructions to the Elders.

Exodus 12:23 (KJV)

²³ For the LORD will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the LORD will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite *you*.

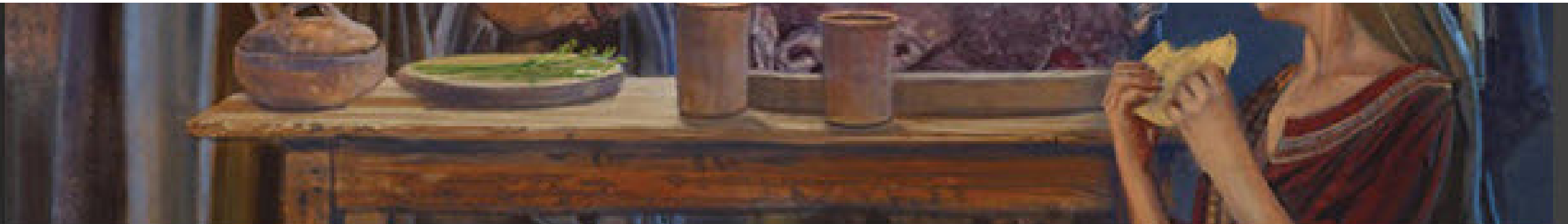
Exodus 12:23 (TEV)

²³ When the LORD goes through Egypt to kill the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the beams and the doorposts and will not let the Angel of Death enter your houses and kill you.

Exodus 12:23 (NIV)

²³ When the LORD goes through the land to strike down the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the top and sides of the doorframe and will pass over that doorway, and he will not permit the destroyer to enter your houses and strike you down.
