

Exodus 12:29 (KJV)

²⁹ And it came to pass, that at midnight the LORD smote all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that *was* in the dungeon; and all the firstborn of cattle.

Exodus 12:29 (TEV)

²⁹ At midnight the LORD killed all the first-born sons in Egypt, from the king's son, who was heir to the throne, to the son of the prisoner in the dungeon; all the first-born of the animals were also killed.

Exodus 12:29 (NIV)

²⁹ At midnight the LORD struck down all the firstborn in Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh, who sat on the throne, to the firstborn of the prisoner, who was in the dungeon, and the firstborn of all the livestock as well.

Exodus 12:33 (KJV)

³³ And the Egyptians were urgent upon the people, that they might send them out of the land in haste: for they said. We be all dead m 3. Purpose Three: Pharaoh and his people to Country; to Exodus 12 Pharaoh and his people to Exodus 12 leave immediately.

³³ The Egyptians urged the people to hurry and leave the country. "For otherwise," they said, "we will all die!"

Exodus 12:34 (KJV)

And the people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneadingtroughs being bound up in their clothes upon their shoulders.

Exodus 12:34 (TEV)

³⁴ So the people filled their baking pans with unleavened dough, wrapped them in clothing, and carried them on their shoulders.

Exodus 12:34 (NIV)

³⁴ So the people took their dough before the yeast was added, and carried it on their shoulders in kneading troughs wrapped in clothing

Exodus 12:35 (KJV)

And the children of Israel did according to the word of Moses; and they borrowed of the Egyptians jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment:

Exodus 12:35 (TEV)

The Israelites had done as Moses had said, and had asked the Egyptians for gold and silver jewelry and for clothes.

Exodus 12:35 (NIV)

³⁵ The Israelites did as Moses instructed and asked the Egyptians for articles of silver and gold and for clothing.

Exodus 12:36 (KJV)

And the LORD gave the people favour in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they lent unto them *such things as they required*. And they spoiled the Egyptians.

Exodus 12:36 (TEV)

The LORD made the Egyptians respect the people and give them what they asked for. In this way the Israelites carried away the wealth of the Egyptians.

Exodus 12:36 (NIV)

³⁶ The LORD had made the Egyptians favorably disposed toward the people, and they gave them what they asked for; so they plundered the Egyptians.

Exodus 12:37 (KJV)

³⁷ And the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand on foot *that were* men, beside children.

Exodus 12:37 (TEV)

³⁷ The Israelites set out on foot from Rameses for Sukkoth. There were about 600,000 men, not counting women and children.

Exodus 12:37 (NIV)

³⁷ The Israelites journeyed from Rameses to Succoth. There were about six hundred thousand men on foot, besides women and children.

Exodus 12:38 (KJV)

³⁸ And a mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, *even* very much cattle.

Exodus 12:38 (TEV)

³⁸ A large number of other people and many sheep, goats, and cattle also went with them.

Exodus 12:38 (NIV)

Many other people went up with them, as well as large droves of livestock, both flocks and herds.

Exodus 12:39 (KJV)

And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough which they brought forth out of Egypt, for it was not leavened; because they were thrust out of Egypt, and could not tarry, neither had they prepared for themselves any victual.

Exodus 12:39 (TEV)

³⁹ They baked unleavened bread from the dough that they had brought out of Egypt, for they had been driven out of Egypt so suddenly that they did not have time to get their food ready or to prepare leavened dough.

Exodus 12:39 (NIV)

With the dough they had brought from Egypt, they baked cakes of unleavened bread. The dough was without yeast because they had been driven out of Egypt and did not have time to prepare food for themselves.

Exodus 12:40 (KJV)

⁴⁰ Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, *was* four hundred and thirty years.

Exodus 12:40 (TEV)

⁴⁰ The Israelites had lived in Egypt for 430 years.

Exodus 12:40 (NIV)

⁴⁰ Now the length of time the Israelite people lived in Egypt was 430 years.

Exodus 12:41 (KJV)


⁴¹ And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the selfsame day it came to pass, that all the hosts of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt.

Exodus 12:41 (TEV)

⁴¹ On the day the 430 years ended, all the tribes of the LORD'S people left Egypt.

Exodus 12:41 (NIV)

⁴¹ At the end of the 430 years, to the very day, all the LORD's divisions left Egypt.



References to Israel's years in Egypt

Exodus 12:42 (KJV)

⁴² It *is* a night to be much observed unto the LORD for bringing them out from the land of Egypt: this *is* that night of the LORD to be observed of all the children of Israel in their generations.

Exodus 12:42 (TEV)

⁴² It was a night when the LORD kept watch to bring them out of Egypt; this same night is dedicated to the LORD for all time to come as a night when the Israelites must keep watch.

Exodus 12:42 (NIV)

⁴² Because the LORD kept vigil that night to bring them out of Egypt, on this night all the Israelites are to keep vigil to honor the LORD for the generations to come.

Exodus 12:43 (KJV)

⁴³ And the LORD said unto Moses and Aaron, This *is* the ordinance of the passover: There shall no stranger eat thereof

Exodus 12:43 (TEV)

⁴³ The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "These are the Passover regulations: No foreigner shall eat the Passover meal,

Exodus 12:43 (NIV)

⁴³ The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "These are the regulations for the Passover: "No foreigner is to eat of it.

Exodus 12:44 (KJV)

⁴⁴ But every man's servant that is bought for money, when thou hast circumcised him, then shall he eat thereof.

Exodus 12:44 (TEV)

but any slave that you have bought may eat it if you circumcise him first.

Exodus 12:44 (NIV)

⁴⁴ Any slave you have bought may eat of it after you have circumcised him,

Exodus 12:45 (KJV)

⁴⁵ A foreigner and an hired servant shall not eat thereof

Exodus 12:45 (TEV)

⁴⁵ No temporary resident or hired worker may eat it.

Exodus 12:45 (NIV)

⁴⁵ but a temporary resident and a hired worker may not eat of it.

Spiritual Identity(<u>vv. 43-50</u>).

Exodus 12:46 (KJV)

⁴⁶ In one house shall it be eaten; thou shalt not carry forth ought of the flesh abroad out of the house; neither shall ye break a bone thereof.

Exodus 12:46 (TEV)

The whole meal must be eaten in the house in which it was prepared; it must not be taken outside. And do not break any of the animal's bones.

Exodus 12:46 (NIV)

⁴⁶ "It must be eaten inside one house; take none of the meat outside the house. Do not break any of the bones.

Exodus 12:47 (KJV)

⁴⁷ All the congregation of Israel shall keep it.

Exodus 12:47 (TEV)

⁴⁷ The whole community of Israel must celebrate this festival,

⁴⁷ The whole community of Israel must celebrate it.

Exodus 12:48 (KJV)

⁴⁸ And when a stranger shall sojourn with thee, and will keep the passover to the LORD, let all his males be circumcised, and then let him come near and keep it; and he shall be as one that is born in the land: for no uncircumcised person shall eat thereof.

Exodus 12:48 (TEV)

but no uncircumcised man may eat it. If a foreigner has settled among you and wants to celebrate Passover to honor the LORD, you must first circumcise all the males of his household. He is then to be treated like a native-born Israelite and may join in the festival.

Exodus 12:48 (NIV)

⁴⁸ "An alien living among you who wants to celebrate the LORD's Passover must have all the males in his household circumcised; then he may take part like one born in the land. No uncircumcised male may eat of it.

Exodus 12:49 (KJV)

One law shall be to him that is homeborn, and unto the stranger that sojourneth among you.

Exodus 12:49 (TEV)

⁴⁹ The same regulations apply to native-born Israelites and to foreigners who settle among you."

Exodus 12:49 (NIV)

⁴⁹ The same law applies to the native-born and to the alien living among you."

Exodus 12:50 (KJV)

⁵⁰ Thus did all the children of Israel; as the LORD commanded Moses and Aaron, so did they.

Exodus 12:50 (TEV)

⁵⁰ All the Israelites obeyed and did what the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron.

Exodus 12:50 (NIV)

⁵⁰ All the Israelites did just what the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron.

Exodus 12:51 (KJV)

⁵¹ And it came to pass the selfsame day, *that* the LORD did bring the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt by their armies.

Exodus 12:51 (TEV)

⁵¹ On that day the LORD brought the Israelite tribes out of Egypt.

Exodus 12:51 (NIV)

⁵¹ And on that very day the LORD brought the Israelites out of Egypt by their divisions
