



## "CHRIST, OUR PASSOVER" part 2 JOHN 13-17; 1 COR. 5:7-8; SUPPORT SCRIPTURE

- I. JESUS' INSTRUCTION ON KEEPING PASSOVER
  - A. He did not negate anything about the <u>original</u> Passover preparation; He had it prepared as prescribed in Exodus
    - 1. No chametz around; <u>clean</u> up; no unleavened bread to be eaten or found
    - 2. Required thoughtful <u>preparation</u> ahead of time
    - 3. It is assumed a first born yearling lamb or goat was roasted
    - 4. <u>Unleavened</u> bread was to be eaten
    - 5. <u>Bitter</u> herbs were to be eaten
    - 6. The cups of wine were an <u>addition</u> to the Exodus account though they may have already been a part of the dinner
    - 7. It is the LORD's Passover we are invited to a peace offering/fellowship meal from Him; He is present with it
  - B. Jesus' new instruction about the meal
    - 1. <u>Washing</u> one another's feet
    - 2. The matzot is given a new symbolic meaning
      - a. The bread, rather than the meat of the Passover, is to be eaten as His <u>body</u>
      - b. It is to be unleavened bread not meat
    - 3. The cup of wine is given a symbolic meaning
      - a. It is symbolic of taking in the life of Jesus
      - b. <u>Prohibitions</u> were given about all others



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- 4. A <u>rehearsal</u> of the disciples' calling, purpose, destiny and terms of obedience are given
- 5. The newly established covenant is to be remembered with each time it is celebrated
- 6. A statement of His return is given

## II. ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTION/EXAMPLE FROM THE APOSTLES

- 1. Acts 2:46 practiced with <u>regularity</u> with gladness and simplicity of heart in a sharing, tight-knit community of followers of Christ
- 2. 1 Cor 5:7-8 "purge out the old leaven" to be a "new lump"; put away all deeds of the flesh
  - a. Keep the feast
  - b. Put away old traditions
  - c. Put away <u>malice</u> and <u>wickedness</u>
  - d. Put on sincerity and truth
  - e. As a "new lump" we are a part of the final Exodus to a new promised land
- 3. 1 Cor 11:17-34 it's the Lord's Supper, His invitation; He is present in someway
  - a. Must be a unified, shared community meal
  - b. Factional divisions must be resolved
  - c. It is a <u>memorial</u> meal to celebrate our delivery
  - d. It is to proclaim the coming again of the Lord Jesus Christ; our death to this world system
  - e. As with the first Passover night, we are to <u>examine</u> ourselves as we take the meal



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
