Palm Sunday- Arrival of the Messiah King- Son of David for Passover

We Gather before Our God and Savior

"Observe the month of Abib and keep the Passover to Yahweh your God, for in the month of Abib Yahweh your God brought you out of Egypt by night. "Three times a year all your males shall appear before Yahweh your God at the place that he will choose.

In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at twilight, is Yahweh's Passover. And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the Feast of Unleavened Bread to Yahweh; for seven days you shall eat unleavened bread. On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall not do any ordinary work. But you shall present a food offering to Yahweh for seven days. On the seventh day is a holy convocation; you shall not do any ordinary work." [Deut. 16:1,16; Leviticus 23:5-8]

Collect for Palm Sunday

Call to Worship

Scripture Proclamation

The Last Passover Feast/First Lord's Supper

Passover Festival Exodus 12:1-28

Yahweh said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. ⁴ And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. ⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, ⁶ and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

⁷ "Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. ⁸ They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. ...¹⁴ "This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to Yahweh; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast. ¹⁵ Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread. On the first day you shall remove leaven out of your houses, for if anyone eats what is leavened, from the first day until the seventh day, that person shall be cut off from Israel. ¹⁶ On the first day you shall hold a holy assembly, and on the seventh day a holy assembly. No work shall be done on those days. But what everyone needs to eat, that alone may be prepared by you. ¹⁷ And you shall observe the Feast of Unleavened Bread, for on this very day I brought your hosts out of the land of Egypt. Therefore you shall observe this day, throughout your generations, as a statute forever. ...

²¹ Then Moses called all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go and select lambs for yourselves according to your clans, and <u>kill the Passover lamb</u>. ²² Take a bunch of hyssop and dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and touch the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood that is in the basin. None of you shall go out of the door of his house until the morning. ²³ For Yahweh will pass through to strike the Egyptians, and when he sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, Yahweh will pass over the door and will not allow the destroyer to enter your houses to strike you. ²⁴ You shall observe this rite as a statute for you and for your sons forever.

²⁸ Then the people of Israel went and did so; as Yahweh had commanded Moses and Aaron, so they did.

Mark 14:12-16

⁷Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, his disciples said to him, "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the Passover? ⁸ So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." ⁹ They said to him, "Where will you have us prepare it?" ¹⁰ He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters ¹¹ and tell the master of the house, "The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' ¹² And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there." ¹³ And they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

Food at Passover of Jesus and his Disciples

Unleavened bread -roasted Lamb- bitter herbs (parsley, celery)-salted water for dipping- wine

Liturgy of the Passover Meal

¹⁴ And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. ¹⁵ And he said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶ For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." ¹⁷ And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, "Take this, and divide it among yourselves. ¹⁸ For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

Exodus 12:25-27

²⁵ And when you come to the land that Yahweh will give you, as he has promised, you shall keep this service. ²⁶ And when your children say to you, 'What do you mean by this service?' ²⁷ you shall say, 'It is the sacrifice of the Yahweh 's Passover, for he passed over the houses of the people of Israel in Egypt, when he struck the Egyptians but spared our houses.'" And the people bowed their heads and worshiped.

Traditional Questions That Jesus Possibly Used

Why is this night different from all other nights?

'With strength of hand Yahweh brought us out from Egypt, from a house of slaves. Exodus 13:14

On all other nights we eat leavened products and matzah, and on this night only matzah.

We eat only matzah because our ancestors could not wait for their breads to rise when they were fleeing slavery in Egypt, and so they were flat when they came out of the oven.

"Remember this day in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, for by a strong hand Yahweh brought you out from this place. No leavened bread shall be eaten. Exodus 13:3

On all other nights we eat all vegetables, and on this night only bitter herbs.

We eat only Maror, a bitter herb, to remind us of the bitterness of slavery that our ancestors endured while in Egypt.

On all other nights, we don't dip our food even once, and on this night we dip twice.

The purpose of dipping the bitter herbs in the salted water is to remind us of the tears our ancestors shed.

"On all other nights we eat meat which has been roasted, stewed, or boiled, but on this night we eat only roasted meat."

We eat only the roasted meat of the sacrificed lamb because our ancestors were protected from the death angel by its blood applied to their doorposts. Exod. 12:6-10

Four Cups

There are four cups of wine during the Seder, one for each of the four promises of God in *Exodus 6:6–7*: Therefore, say to the Israelites: 'I am Yahweh, and I will bring you out **[the cup of sanctification]** from under the yoke of the Egyptians. I will free you from being slaves to them **[the cup of judgment]**, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment **[the cup of redemption]**. I will take you as my own people **[the cup of praise]**, and I will be your God.

In the New Testament accounts, we find reference to the First Cup, also known as the Cup of Blessing (Luke 22:17); to the breaking of the matzoh (Luke 22:19); to the Third Cup, the Cup of Redemption (Luke 22:20); to reclining (Luke 22:14); to the charoseth or the maror (Matthew 26:23), and to the Hallel (Matthew 26:30). In particular, the matzoh and the Third Cup are given special significance by Jesus.

Liturgy of the Upper Room

"It was while Jesus and the Twelve were keeping the Feast of the Passover that our Lord instituted the ordinance of the Holy Supper, to serve essentially the same purposes served by the sacrifices of the preceding four millenniums. After that final Passover day and its attendant lifting up upon the cross of the true Paschal Lamb, the day for the proper celebration of the ancient feast ceased. After that Paul was able to say: 'Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us,' and to give the natural exhortation that flowed therefrom: 'Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.' (1 Cor. 5:7–8.)" (The Promised Messiah, pp. 429–31.)

For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

Disciples Gathered Gladly

Disciples gathered gladly to share a festive meal; they came all unsuspecting the grief they soon would feel. Their Lord began to tell them his hour of death was near; the one who would betray him could see his pathway clear.

Then as they sat at supper he blessed and broke the bread. This is my body broken for love of you, he said. Take each of you a portion remembering when you do, as often as you eat it, my life laid down for you.

And when the meal was finished, he poured a cup of wine. This cup is the new covenant and your salvation sign. Through my death are forgiven your sins both great and small. Drink each of you remembering my blood poured out for all.
