#### **EXPOSITION OF GENESIS**

Message #83 Genesis 39:6-20

One of the main warnings of the New Testament is the warning to stay away from sexual immorality: 1) Matthew 5:28 - Lust after a woman = committing adultery; 2) Mark 7:21-23 - Out of heart proceeds evil thoughts, fornications. . .adulteries; 3) Acts 15:29 - Abstain from fornication; 4) Romans 13:12-13 - Lay aside deeds of darkness. . .sexual promiscuity and sensuality; 5) I Cor. 5:11 - Do not associate with an immoral person; 6) I Cor. 6:13 - The body is not for immorality; 7) I Cor. 6:18 - Flee immorality; 8) II Cor. 12:21 - I am afraid that you have not repented of the impurity, immorality and sensuality; 9) Gal. 5:16, 19 - Deeds of flesh are immorality, impurity, sensuality; 10) Eph. 5:3-4 - Let not immorality or any impurity be named among you... no filthiness and silly talk; 11) Col. 3:5-6 - Consider your body dead to immorality; impurity, passion, evil desire...; 12) I Thess. 4:3-7 - Abstain from sexual immorality; 13) Heb. 12:16 - See to it that...there be no immoral or godless person; 14) Hebrews 13:4 - God will judge fornicators and adulterers; 15) I Peter 4:2-3 - Do not live life in the flesh after lusts of sensuality; 16) Rev. 2:14 - People in Pergamum church were rebuked by Jesus Christ for immorality; 17) Rev. 2:20-21 - People in Thyatiran church were warned by Jesus Christ for not repenting of immorality. Clearly sexual immorality is a temptation we must avoid.

Joseph was a man who said no to sinful temptation and he landed in jail.

# THE BELIEVER WHO REFUSES TO YIELD TO SINFUL SEXUAL TEMPTATIONS MAY INITIALLY <u>EXPERIENCE</u> SOME VERY NEGATIVE THINGS, BUT EVENTUALLY THAT BELIEVER WILL BE HIGHLY <u>EXALTED</u> BY GOD.

In Psalm 105 we learn some critical information about Joseph: God sent him to Egypt ahead of <u>Israel</u> (105:17); when in prison he was bound with irons that <u>hurt</u> his feet (105:18); in the aftermath of this experience Joseph was able to <u>teach</u> others (105:22); it was the LORD who was <u>testing</u> Joseph (105:19).

# NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #1 - The positive qualities of Joseph. 39:6

Joseph had all the marks of a corporate <u>executive</u>, who would be a prize catch for any woman. He was single and <u>prosperous</u> (39:2-3). He was in <u>management</u> (39:5). He was <u>handsome</u>, which means he had a good form and face (39:6b). Joseph was a well built, good looking, successful, single business man but the reason God will so exalt Joseph is not because of his beauty or body, but his <u>faithfulness</u> to Him. You can expect temptation to come at you the most, not when you are down and out, but when you are prospering and successful and good at what you do.

### NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #2 - The evil enticement of Potiphar's wife. 39:7

Potiphar's wife is a woman who is immoral and a woman who is a <u>liar</u> (39:14-18). For an Egyptian woman who was socially and financially secure to desire a Jewish <u>slave</u>, is a remarkable testimony to Joseph's impressiveness. When she looked at Joseph, she was overtaken with lust and she does not try to seductively lure him into anything, but in a very forthright manner she asks him to lie with her. She wants to have sex with him.

# NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #3 - The steadfast <u>loyalty</u> of Joseph. 39:8-9

Joseph was a faithful and loyal man of God. When Joseph was faced with a temptation "he refused," which means Potiphar's wife could not turn his <u>will</u> to having sex with her. Saying no to temptation is an act of will, not feelings or emotions.

## Area of Loyalty #1 - Joseph was loyal to his master. 39:8-9a

Joseph appreciated his master's trust. Joseph was in charge over everything that his master owned and he would not violate that trust and touch his wife.

# Area of Loyalty #2 – Joseph was loyal to his God. 39:9b

Verse 9 is clear to reveal that Joseph viewed sexual immorality as a wicked evil sin against God. Joseph did not want to do anything God would classify as evil sin. As W.H. Griffith Thomas said, "To him God was first" (*Genesis*, p. 372).

# **NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #4 -** The relentless <u>enticements</u> from Potiphar's wife. 39:10- 12a

When you say "no" to temptation, don't expect it to immediately disappear, because it may <u>intensify</u>. Every day Potiphar's wife begged Joseph to have sex with her. Sexual harassment is nothing new to our age; it is as old as Genesis.

#### NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #5 - The godly reaction of Joseph. 39:13

The word "garment" indicates it was his outer coat. If ever there were a man who had coat problems it is Joseph. His first coat was taken as proof he was dead and this coat is taken to try to prove rape.

- (**Observation #1**) The best thing to do sometime is literally run away from temptation. Peter says "abstain" from lusts (I Peter 2:11); Paul says flee them (II Timothy 2:22).
- (**Observation #2**) Circumstantial evidence proves nothing. Do not jump to conclusions until you have the facts.

#### **NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #6 -** The lying reaction of Potiphar's wife. 39:14-18

Potiphar's wife is angry that Joseph won't sleep with her so she makes up lies about him.

# **NARRATIVE PERSPECTIVE #7 -** The <u>emotional</u> wrong reaction of Potiphar. 39:19-20

Potiphar could have executed Joseph, but God had other plans for him.

#### **Practical Lessons:**

- 1) Faithfulness to God does not mean exemption from trials and temptations.
- 2) Faithfulness to God does mean fleeing and abstaining from the temptation.

- 3) Faithfulness to God is monitored by God through the trials and temptations.4) Faithfulness to God during trials and temptations may bring immediate difficulty into your life.
- 5) Faithfulness to God will ultimately bring great reward and honor.
