Call to Worship

(the Sursum Corda (modified))

We worship the triune God in the power of the Spirit, and here express the propriety of the worship in which we now engage, combining an ancient expression of the Church's conviction with words from the recorded worship of heaven in Revelation 5.

WE ACKNOWLEDGE OUR SIN

* Reading from the Law

God's law always pointed to the reality of the resurrection, both that of Christ, and then of them that belong to Him. We are obligated thus to trust in its realization.

Numbers 19:11–13 ESV

Whoever touches the dead body of any person shall be unclean seven days. ¹² He shall cleanse himself with the water on the third day and on the seventh day, and so be clean. But if he does not cleanse himself on the third day and on the seventh day, he will not become clean. ¹³ Whoever touches a dead person, the body of anyone who has died, and does not cleanse himself, defiles the tabernacle of the LORD, and that person shall be cut off from Israel; because the water for impurity was not thrown on him, he shall be unclean. His uncleanness is still on him.

Silent Confession of Sin Corporate Confession of Sin

This prayer of confession, as you might notice, is based on the theology of resurrection as it points to the new life to which we aspire and which we ask God in His mercy to produce in us following the mortification (i.e., the putting to death) of our sin.

Lord God! Eternal and Almighty Father, we acknowledge and confess before Your holy Majesty that we are poor sinners, conceived and born in guilt and in corruption, prone to do evil, unable of ourselves to do any good, who, by reason of our depravity, transgress without end Your holy commandments. Therefore, we have drawn upon ourselves, by Your just sentence, condemnation and death. But, Oh Lord! With heartfelt sorrow, we repent and deplore our offenses. We condemn ourselves and our evil ways, with true repentance beseeching that Your grace may relieve our distress.

Be pleased to have compassion on us, O most gracious God, Father of all mercies, for the sake of Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. And in removing our guilt and our pollution, grant us the daily increase of the grace of Your Holy Spirit, that acknowledging from our inmost heart our own unrighteousness, we may be touched with sorrow that shall work true repentance, and that Your Spirit, mortifying all sin within us, may produce the fruits of holiness, righteousness, and new life well pleasing in Your sight. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

Christ has provided the definitive answer to death, conquering it by resolving the problem of our sin through His death and perfect life.

I Corinthians 15:20-23, 29 ESV

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ.

²⁹ Otherwise, what do people mean by being baptized on behalf of the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why are people baptized on their behalf?

Leader: This is the gospel. Congregation: Hallelujah!

- I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.

WE RESPOND TO THE GRACE OF THE LORD

Offering Meditation

The Sadducees, who were the priestly class, presided over the ritual sacrifices brought to the Temple by God's people. But ironically, as unbelievers in resurrection, they were presiding over offerings to a God who proclaimed Himself the God of those who were dead. Jesus offers a needed correction to both them and us as we present our offerings to God.

Matthew 22:23-33 ESV

The same day Sadducees came to him, who say that there is no resurrection, and they asked him a question, ²⁴ saying, "Teacher, Moses said, 'If a man dies having no children, his brother must marry the widow and raise up offspring for his brother.' ²⁵ Now there were seven brothers among us. The first married and died, and having no offspring left his wife to his brother. ²⁶ So too the second and third, down to the seventh. ²⁷ After them all, the woman died. ²⁸ In the resurrection, therefore, of the seven, whose wife will she be? For they all had her.''

²⁹ But Jesus answered them, "You are wrong, because you know neither the Scriptures nor the power of God. ³⁰ For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. ³¹ And as for the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God: ³² 'I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not God of the dead, but of the living." ³³ And when the crowd heard it, they were astonished at his teaching.
