4. Due to modern conveniences in cooking, travel, cleaning, working, etc., we have more time to pray than ever. However, this does not seem to be happening. What are 5 of the most common problems that keep us from praying as we should?

5. Read Romans 15:30-32. What are Paul's prayer requests?

Does Paul believe that their prayers matter to his current situation and future? _____ If Paul, and Apostle, evangelist, missionary, church starter, elder, and author much of the New Testament, asked people to pray for him so often, what does that mean for you?

Lastly, we see Paul's desire to be back with the believers in Rome. The author of Hebrews and Paul greatly desired to spend time with their fellow believers. What did Paul state would be the benefit of being around them again (see vs. 32)?
