II. How are we to pray?

- A. We are to pray to God as He revealed Himself
 - 1. Implies we need to study Who He is a sampling:
 - a. Gen. 17:3
 - b. Ex. 3:5 Joshua 5:14-15
 - c. Num 20:6
 - d. Ex. 34:8-9; Num. 14:14-20
 - 2. What Jesus reveals in Luke 11 about *God's character* is astounding
 - a. strength of Jesus' parables is in His use of contrasts
 - b. observe the contrast between the friend and God
 - 3. Reflect: Describe for yourself 'how you think about God?' Is this matching the revelation God gives in Jesus of Himself?
- B. We are to pray to God with persistence: Luke 11:8-10
 - 1. Jesus commends the neighbor's importunity (persistence)
 - 2. Scripture sets out various examples of persistent prayer
 - a. Gen. 32:26

b. Luke 24:29 c. Matt. 15:21-28 3. Reflect: Trace how persistent you are in your supplications. C. We ought to turn to God with *great reverence*: Malachi 1:6-14 (HC, q. 120) 1. Malachi protests against scandalous irreverence of priest and people 2. Apply Malachi's teaching to our *public worship* 3. Apply Malachi's call to your family prayers & family worship 4. Apply Malachi's protest to our *personal – secret prayer – life* (6-8) Close: What is our hope and comfort as we face our poor prayer life?
