"Shining Christ's Light on Dark Impurity" (Ephesians 5:3–14)

Big Idea: We who are Christ's light must shun and illumine dark impurity.

- I. Christians shun dark impurity. (verses 3–6)
 - a. Shun impure actions and desires as saints. (verse 3)
 - b. Replace casual filth and folly with thanksgiving. (verse 4)
 - c. Reject the idolatrous impurity which damns all whom it defines. (verses 5–6)

- II. Christians are now light and not darkness. (verses 7–10)
 - a. Christians cannot share the lifestyle of rebels against God. (verse 7)
 - 1 Peter 4:3-5
 - b. Christians must pursue a lifestyle which matches their new nature. (verse 8)
 - Colossians 1:9-14
 - c. Christians must produce God's own virtues in their lifestyle. (verse 9)
 - 2 Peter 1:2-4
 - d. Christians must determine how to please the Lord in their lifestyle. (verse 10)
 - Romans 12:2
- III. Christians illumine dark impurity. (verses 11–14)
 - a. The fruit of light exposes and transforms the shameful works of darkness.
 (verses 11–14a)
 - Hebrews 11:7

b. Christ is the God who speaks light and life into darkness and death. (verse 14b)
