The triumph of the resurrection results in praise to God. God receives direct from Christ. 22–24

God's praise will be swift. Luke 24:36–47

God's praise will be sincere.

God's praise will be significant. Isaiah 53:10-12

God receives indirect praise from Christ. 25–26 God will ensure Christ is praised for His obedience.

Christ's obedience will ensure those the afflicted are satisfied.

The future satisfaction of the afflicted will result in God's praise.

God receives universal praise. 27–29

God receives precise praise. 30–31 Praise will be obtained through the ministry of future suffering servants.

Praise will be obtained precisely for His righteousness.
