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**WLC Q. 75.** What is sanctification? A. Sanctification is a work of God's grace, whereby they whom God hath before the foundation of the world chosen to be holy, are in time through the powerful operation of his Spirit, 1) applying the death and resurrection of Christ unto them, 2) renewed in their whole man after the image of God; 3) having the seeds of repentance unto life, and all other saving graces, put into their hearts, and 4) those graces so stirred up, increased, and strengthened, as that they more and more die unto sin and 5) rise unto newness of life. **WLC Q. 3.** What is the Word of God? A. The Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the Word of God, the only rule of faith and obedience. **WLC Q. 4.** How doth it appear that the Scriptures are the Word of God? A. The Scriptures manifest themselves to be the Word of God, by their majesty and purity; by the consent of all the parts, and the scope of the whole, which is to give all glory to God; by their light and power to convince and convert sinners, to comfort and build up believers unto salvation: but the Spirit of God bearing witness by and with the Scriptures in the heart of man, is alone able fully to persuade it that they are the very Word of God. **WLC Q. 5.** What do the Scriptures principally teach? A. The Scriptures principally teach, what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

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**WLC Q. 183.** For whom are we to pray? A. We are to pray for the whole church of Christ upon earth; for magistrates and ministers; for ourselves, our brethren, yea, our enemies; and for all sorts of men living, or that shall live hereafter; but not for the dead, nor for those that are known to have sinned the sin unto death. **WLC Q. 62.** What is the visible Church? A. The visible Church is a society made up of all such as in all ages and places of the world do profess the true religion, and of their children. **WLC Q. 63.** What are the special privileges of the visible Church? A. The visible Church hath the privilege of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ to all the members of it in the ministry of the gospel, testifying, that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him.
