Matthew 28:1-15 "Decision Time" April 16, 2017 OT: Isaiah 55 Larry Yeager

Theme: There are very few ways to respond to the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. And only one of them ends in life with Him.

Introduction: July 21, 1969. The moon landing: did it actually happen? A look at three different responses to the most important event in the history of the world.

- I. Those Who Refuse to Believe: The Jewish Rulers Those responsible for Jesus' crucifixion
 - A. In spite of His claims
 - 1. The Lord's anointed (Luke 4:18-21)
 - 2. Forgiving Sins: Truly "only God can do that" (Matthew 9:2; Luke7:47)
 - 3. His relationship to God the Father
 - a. Seen Jesus? You have seen the Father (John 14:9)
 - b. One with the Father (John 10:30)
 - 4. To rise from the dead (Matthew 27:63)
 - B. In spite of the evidence
 - 1. Power over sickness and infirmity
 - a. Paralysis (Matthew 9:5, 6)
 - b. Uncleanness (Luke 8:43)
 - c. Blindness (John 9)
 - d. Leprosy (Luke 17)
 - 2. Power over the physical world
 - a. Water to wine (John 2)
 - b. The weather (Matthew 8)
 - c. Physical properties of matter (John 6)
 - d. Feeding thousands with five loaves and two fish (Matthew 14)
 - 3. Power over the spiritual realm
 - a. Casting out demons (Matthew 12)
 - b. Delivering a man crazed by demons (Mark 5)
 - 4. Power over death
 - a. Jairus' daughter (Luke 8 / Mark 5)
 - b. Widow of Nain's son (Luke 7)
 - c. Lazarus (John 11)
 - C. Their deadly actions
 - 1. Attempts to destroy His ministry
 - a. In league with the Devil? (Matthew 12:24)
 - b. A terrible sinner
 - 2. Seeking His life
 - a. And succeeding!
 - b. According to God's foreknowledge and plan (Acts 2:23)
 - D. Refusal leads to fear: Fearing Him in life and in death
- II. Those Who Try to Recuse Themselves: The Guards
 - A. The hired help
 - 1. A frightening experience: More than they bargained for
 - 2. Reporting to the chief priests: Payoff convinces them "they didn't see what they saw"
 - B. Committed to themselves
 - 1. This is not their fight
 - 2. Silence is profitable!
 - C. Not their decision

- 1. We don't have to take sides
- 2. They have made their choice: Not a bold refusal to believe but a rejection none the less

III. Those Who Rejoice in Believing: The Women

- A. Sorrow to joy
 - 1. Came to grieve
 - 2. Grief is shattered
- B. It's all true!
 - 1. Every word, every promise
 - 2. All confirmed in life!
- C. A powerful encounter
 - 1. The Message: "He has risen"
 - 2. The Invitation: "Come and see"
 - 3. The Commission: "Go quickly and tell His disciples"
 - 4. The Meeting: The risen Savior meets them

IV. Our Turn to Decide

- A. The circumstances change
 - 1. Not the same culture that Jesus came to
 - 2. The attacks continue
 - 3. None have stood
- B. The choice remains
 - 1. Some refuse to believe that Jesus is anything unusual Rejecting the truth leads to fear
 - 2. Some wish to recuse themselves
 - a. Claiming that they haven't decided one way or the other
 - b. "Whoever is not with me is against me" (Luke 11:23)
