- **A.** Warnings from the Text
 - 1) It is easier to tear down and destroy.
 - 2) Folly ruins the purpose of our work.
 - 3) Folly ruins the the enjoyment of life.
- **B.** Answering the Objection: But isn't there grace?
 - **1)** Response 1: Yes, but there are also consequences to our sins.
 - **2)** Response 2: One of the motivations to flee from temptation is the fear of its consequences.
- C. Remedies to Counter the Corruption of Folly
 - 1) The Ninth Commandment (Larger Catechism 145)
 - **2)** Be on guard (Rev 16:15)
 - **3)** Be quick to confess and repent.
 - **4)** Be quick to forgive and move on.

11. Folly Is Clear (vv 2-3).

- **A.** Warnings from the Text
 - 1) The fool is weak of heart (Psa 112:7-8)
 - 2) The weak of heart are loose with their words, venting their innermost sorrows before all (Jonah 4:9).
- **B.** Answering the Objections
 - 1) Objection 1: But this is my personality!
 - 2) Objection 2: But I am suffering so much!
 - a) Response 1: Look at the sufferings of Christ.
 - **b)** *Response 2:* Consider the faithful examples of godlier saints (Hab 3:17-19)
 - c) Response 3: Take your sorrows to the Lord (Psa 64:1a)
 - d) Response 4: Drink from the still waters of God's promises.
 - **e)** *Response 5:* Consider well what is shared and with whom (Pr 13:16)
- C. Remedies to Counter the Glaring Fruits of Folly
 - **1)** There is clearly a need to strengthen the guard of both the heart and the tongue.
 - **2)** Pray for the working of the Holy Spirit as you pursue sanctification, which is a free grace of God!

111. Folly Is Inconstant (v 4).

A. Warning from the Text

Concise Sermon Outline with References

- **1)** The fool, particularly when he has more liberty in abuse of power, such as the foolish ruler (which is a thing not unique to our own day) is often inconstant in passion, inconsistent in loyalty, and intemperate in speech. The spirit of the ruler rises against you. (Pr 16:32)
- 2) The assumption is that, in particular, the fool hates the wise and the student of wisdom.
- **B.** Answering the Objection: But shouldn't we be quick to calm down?
 - 1) Response 1: Yes.
 - 2) Response 2: No.
- C. Remedies to Counter the Inconstancy of Folly
 - 1) Do not just leave at every offense
 - 2) Make peace as much as you can (Pr 15:1; Rom 12:17-18)
 - 3) Enjoy the blessing of peace (Psa 29:10-11)
 - **4)** Rest in the constancy of the Lord and the conciliation of Christ's blood. (Col 3:20; Rom 5:1, 8:38-39; Song of Songs 8:6-7a)

rv. Folly Is Common (vv 5-7).

- **A.** Warnings from the Text
 - **1)** Foolishness is not only common in low places, but in high places as well.
 - **2)** Foolishness is not just infirmity and ignorance, it is immorality.
- **B.** Remedies to Counter the Commonness of Folly
 - 1) Our King never errs.
 - 2) Yet, Christ became as a servant.
 - 3) Do not be proud, but rather rejoice in salvation which is given freely by God and accomplished by Christ and applied effectually by the Holy Spirit (Psa 113)
 - **4)** Let us, then, walk in wisdom, knowing this too is a gift from God, shown forth to us in the written Word, as well as in the Person of the Incarnate Word.
