Introduction

- 1. We are soldiers in a fierce battle every moment of our lives.
- 2. We pray in the knowledge that Jesus is our Lord who arose on the third day.

Our Spiritual Warfare

- 1. The Catechism describes the Christian life using the Biblical language of warfare between two kingdoms. We must know our enemy.
- 2. We must understand the nature of this warfare...it is spiritual in nature and the enemy's chief weapon is temptation.

Our Fervent Petition

- 1. Because we are so weak and we need God's grace, Jesus teaches us to pray, "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." There are two parts here:
 - a. First, Jesus teaches us to pray, "Lead us not into temptation ... "
 - b. Jesus teaches us to pray, "Deliver us from evil." Literally, "evil one."
- 2. May we rise up in our prayers and pray this with great fervency.

Our Assured Confidence

- 1. We have the assurance that God is able to do what we ask, "for thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever."
- 2. This confidence is expressed with the final word of prayer, "Amen."
