



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What Solomon is talking about in Proverbs 18.

Proverbs 18:1-24

- 1. Avoid sinful attitudes and speech (vv. 1-8).
- 2. Seek security in the Lord (vv. 9-15).
- 3. Adhere to justice (vv. 16-19).
- 4. Realize the amazing power of words (vv. 20-21).
- 5. Know that a good spouse is a treasure, a favor from the Lord (v. 22).
- 6. Be merciful to the poor: Do not be like some of the rich who speak harshly to them (v. 23).
- 7. Develop loyal friends: One true friend is more valuable than many superficial friends (who can cause problems) (v. 24).



Proverbs 18:4 (KJV)

⁴ The words of a man's mouth *are as* deep waters, *and* the wellspring of wisdom *as* a flowing brook.

Proverbs 18:4 (TEV)

⁴ A person's words can be a source of wisdom, deep as the ocean, fresh as a flowing stream.

Proverbs 18:4 (NIV)

⁴ The words of a man's mouth are deep waters, but the fountain of wisdom is a bubbling brook.

Proverbs 18:20 (KJV)


²⁰ A man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth; *and* with the increase of his lips shall he be filled.

Proverbs 18:20 (TEV)

²⁰ You will have to live with the consequences of everything you say.

Proverbs 18:20 (NIV)

²⁰ From the fruit of his mouth a man's stomach is filled; with the harvest from his lips he is satisfied.



Proverbs 18:21 (KJV)

²¹ Death and life *are* in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

Proverbs 18:21 (TEV)

What you say can preserve life or destroy it; so you must accept the consequences of your words.

Proverbs 18:21 (NIV)

²¹ The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

Colossians 4:6 (KJV)

⁶ Let your speech *be* alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.


Colossians 4:6 (TEV)

Your speech should always be pleasant and interesting, and you should know how to give the right answer to everyone.

Colossians 4:6 (NIV)

⁶ Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

1. Conversation needs to be about more than merely expressing your opinion.



2. Conversation needs to be about more than confirming your biases.

3. Conversation needs to be about more than dishing the dirt.




Chart a New Course in Your Conversation. HOW?
