## THE NECESSITY OF HOLINESS

Hebrews 12:14-17

- **I. PEACE** (14a; Isa 9:6 & 52:7; Rom 5:1; Gal 5:22; 2 Cor 13:11)—wholeness, completeness, well-being, security, harmony in relationship
  - A. Making Every Effort (Rom 12:18 & 14:19)—personal responsibility
    - 1. It takes effort. (Ps 34:14)—peace is not passive, must be pursued
    - 2. Not always possible.
      - **a.** Not at any cost (Jer 8:11; Jn 15:18-20; Jam 4:4)—truth and holiness must be maintained
      - **b.** Not one-sided (1 Cor 7:12-15)—both parties have to be willing
      - **c.** Not Enabling Evil (2 Kin 9:22; Prov 24:11-12; 2 Cor 6:14)—
    - 3. Peace should be prioritized. (Eph 4:1-3)—the desire, goal; way of life
  - **B.** <u>Being a Peaceable Person</u> (Col 3:15; 1 Pet 3:8-11; Jam 3:16-18 & 4:1)—don't be the *cause* of trouble or one to *keep it going*.
  - **C.** <u>Having Peace with Others</u> (Mat 5:9; 2 Cor 5:18; Eph 2:14-15 & 6:15)—The gospel reconciles relationships, peace with God & others.
- **II. HOLINESS** (14b; Lev 11:45; Mt 5:8; Heb 13:4; 1 Pet 1;15;)
  - **A.** What Holiness Is (Lev 20:26; Ps 96:9; 1 Pet 2:9)—
    - **1. Separated from the world for God** (Lev 20:26; 1 Pet 2:9)—devoted to the service of God
    - **2. God's character**—a reflection of His essential nature
  - B. Why Holiness Is Necessary ()—to have fellowship with God
    - **1. To See God** (Mat 5:8)—only the pure in heart
    - **2.** To <u>Be Like</u> Him (12:10-11; 2 Pet 1:4; 1 Jn 3:2)—partake in his nature

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## C. What Destroys Holiness

**1.** <u>Bitter Root</u> (Deut 29:18)—a sin that will produce bitter fruit (consequences) for the *entire community* 

- **2. Sexual Immorality** (1 Cor 6:9-11, 18-20; Gal 5:19, 21; Eph 5:3, 5; Col 3:5; 1 Th 4:3, 7; 1 Pet 2:11; Jude 1:7; Rev 2:14, 20-22)—fornication, adultery, homosexuality and other sexual perversions
- **3.** <u>Godless like Esau</u>—profane, irreligious, no sense of spiritual value; sensuality, fleshly minded
  - a. Prioritizes the here and now over the eternal.
  - b. Prioritizes comfort and pleasure over spiritual blessing
- **III. GRACE** (15; 2 Cor 6:11; Gal 5:4, 7; Heb 3:12 & 4:16; 1 Pet 1:13)—power of God given to believers that saves and enables them to live a holy life.
  - **A.** Grace <u>saves</u> and puts you on the path of righteousness. Salvation is what God does for us, not that we earn or deserve it; He redeems us.
  - **B.** Grace <u>enables</u> you to continue and complete the journey. (Tit 2:11-12)—gives power to overcome sin
  - C. We must <u>avail</u> ourselves of this grace. (Heb 4:16 & 12:25)—take and use it

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
