A. Generally it meant to cause someone unfavorably inclined to become favorably inclined... Hebrews 9: 24-26

B. In the Old Testament it Means to Cover...

- 1. In reference to sin...
- 2. Its effect is cleansing and forgiveness...
- 3. It is before the Lord...

F. Propitiation Presupposes the Wrath of God...

<u>Summary:</u>

- Vital Implications:
 1. Forgiveness and standing before God who is perfectly righteous comes only through "faith in Christ..."

 I Peter 2:4; 3:18; Hebrews 9:14.
 - 2. Propitiation displays the perfect wisdom of God... I Corinthians 1:18-25.
 - 3. Propitiation does not set the moral Law of God aside (it establishes it). See, Romans 3:27ff

IV. <u>Three Clarifications Concerning Propitiation and Unwarranted Criticism of the Doctrine...</u>

- A. To love and to be propitious are not convertible terms... John 3:16; I John 4:9-10.
- B. Propitiation does not somehow turn God's wrath into love...
- C. Propitiation does not in the least detract from the love and mercy of God...
