## Family Worship Guide

Memory Verse: Psalm 32:8-9

Day 1: Read 2 Chron. 28:6-9, 27; 29:3 and discuss: Why was the nation of Israel divided into 2 kingdoms? What did the first king of the northern kingdom do in order to keep people from defecting to the southern kingdom? What did the northern kingdom do that "reached up to heaven"? What does Hezekiah do in chapter 29? Discuss the impact these passages should have on your daily lives as Christians.

Day 2: Read 2 Chron. 30:1 and discuss: What does Passover celebrate? How do you imagine Hezekiah must have been tempted to feel towards the northern kingdom? *Who* did Hezekiah invite to Passover? Why is this significant?

**Day 3: Read 2 Chron. 30:2-6 and discuss:** *Why* was it unlikely that Israel would respond well to Hezekiah's invitation? What aspect about the timing of Passover did Hezekiah choose to alter? Why? What phrase did Hezekiah use that meant "repentance" was required? What did the people need to turn *from*? What do the people you know need to turn from? What do *you* still need to turn from?
