Pursuing Peace by Forgiving Others. Mt. 18:21-35

I. Introduction.

- A. Our peacemaking is founded upon God's peacemaking in the gospel. Rom. 5:1
 - 1. Conflict is unavoidable and dangerous, but conflict also gives us opportunity to glorify God. Rom. 12:18 1 Cor. 10:31 2 Cor. 5:9
 - 2. First, get the log out of your own eye. Mt. 7:1-5 5:23-24
 - 3. Then pursue peace by gently restoring others. Mt. 7:5 18:15-20
 - a. Does this violate the right to privacy? 1 Tim. 1:19-20 Eph. 5:11
 - b. Do these techniques ever fail? Pr. 3:5-6 Rom. 12:18
- B. The importance of forgiveness.

II. You have been forgiven much. Mt. 18:23-27

- A. You owed a great debt which you could not repay. Mt. 18:23-25 Rom. 3:23 6:23
 - 1. Do you see your sin the way Jesus does? Rom. 3:10-20 Isa. 64:6 59:2
 - 2. You must take your sin and guilt seriously before God will forgive you. <u>1 Jo. 1:8,10</u>
- B. God graciously forgave your debt when you asked Him. Mt. 18:25-27 1 Jo. 1:8-2:2 Ps. 32:1-5 Isa. 55:6-7 Rom. 3:23-24 6:23
 - 1. When the slave humbled himself, the king had compassion and forgave him.
 - 2. In the same way God freely and graciously forgave you. 1 Jo. 1:9 2:1-2 Rom. 3:23-24 6:23 Titus 3:4-5
 - 3. The forgiveness you received is better than that which is described in the parable.
 - a. Jesus paid your debt in full. <u>2 Co. 8:9 5:21</u> 1 Pe. 3:18 Ro. 3:24-26 1 Jo. 2:2
 - b. He also enriches you with His righteousness. 2 Cor. 5:21 8:9 Phil. 3:9
- C. The key to becoming a gracious forgiving person is to mediate daily on God's gracious forgiveness to you. Luke 7:47 Ps. 86:5 Eph. 4:31-32 Col. 3:12-14 Ro. 5:1 Ps. 103:10,12 130:3-4 Isa. 1:18 38:17 Ex. 34:6-7 Jer. 31:34 Micah 7:18-20 John 1:29
- D. Have you experienced God's forgiveness? Isa. 55:6-7 1 Jo. 1:8-2:2 Phil. 3:9

III. Forgive others as God has forgiven you. Matthew 18:21-22,28-35

- A. Forgiveness can be very hard. Matthew 18:21,28
 - 1. One hundred denarii represents one third of a year's wage -- \$17,000 to us.
 - 2. It is significant that the debt owed by the second slave wasn't a paltry amount.
 - 3. Yet the debt owed by the second slave is nothing compared to the debt of the first slave which had been forgiven.
- B. Forgiveness is not optional for forgiven people. Mt. 6:12,14-15 18:21-22,28-35
 - 1. The One who has forgiven your great debt asks you to forgive others for His sake. Mt. 18:21-22 6:12,14-15 Mark 11:25 Luke 17:3
 - 2. God does not allow you to carry on a grudge. Eph. 4:26-27,31-32
 - 3. Refusing to forgive shows that you have disconnected yourself from the gospel. Mt. 18:28-35 Luke 7:47
 - 4. Is Jesus saying that you can lose your salvation? Mt. 18:32-35 Js. 2:13
- C. Our forgiving should resemble God's forgiveness. Eph. 4:31-32
 - 1. Forgiveness is freely granted to the one who asks. 1 John 1:9
 - 2. Forgiveness cancels a debt -- declared and decisive. Mt. 18:27
 - 3. Forgiveness is from the heart. Mt. 18:35

- 4. Forgiveness restores relationships—reconciliation. Rom. 5:10-11 2 Co. 5:18-20
- 5. Forgiveness does good to the offender. Mt. 5:44ff Ro. 12:19-21 II Co. 2:7-8 8:9
- D. Misunderstandings about forgiveness.
 - 1. Forgiving is not merely forgetting. Jer. 31:34 <u>Isa. 43:25</u> 1 Co. 13:5
 - 2. Forgiveness is not lightly excusing sin. Col. 1:20
 - 3. Forgiveness is not easy.
- E. Make the promises of forgiveness (from *The Peacemaker*). Mt. 6:12 <u>I Co. 13:5</u> <u>Jer. 31:34</u> Eph. 4:31-32 Col. 3:13
 - 1. I will not think about this incident.
 - 2. I will not bring this incident up and use it against you. 1 Co. 13:5
 - 3. I will not talk to others about this incident.
 - 4. I will not allow this incident to stand between us or to hinder our personal relationship. Eph. 4:31-32
- F. The gospel empowers forgiveness. <u>Eph. 4:31-32</u> Col. 3:12-14 1 Tim. 1:15-16
- G. Questions about forgiveness.
 - 1. How can I know that he is really repentant? 2 Co. 7:10-11 Mt. 18:21f 1 Co. 13:7
 - 2. What if I don't feel like forgiving? Phil. 4:13
 - 3. What should I do if someone's apology is lame (falls short)? Pr. 19:11 1 Pet. 4:8
 - 4. Can I forgive someone while still keeping my distance from them?
 - 5. Does forgiveness always eliminate all consequences? Num. 14:20-23 2 Sam. 12:10-14 Gal. 6:6-7
 - 6. What if the offender keeps doing the same thing? Mt. 18:21-22,15-20
 - 7. What if I have trouble forgiving myself? 1 Jo. 1:8-2:2 1 Co. 6:9-11 1 Ti. 1:15-16
- H. What if those who have wronged you won't seek your forgiveness? Luke 17:3
 - 1. You should have always have a heart <u>attitude</u> of forgiveness. Eph. 4:31-32 Luke 23:34 Acts 7:59-60 Mark 11:25 Rom. 12:18-21 1 Pet. 2:22-23
 - 2. <u>Transactional</u> forgiveness leading to full reconciliation can only take place when the guilty party seeks forgiveness. <u>Lu. 17:3-4</u> Mt. 18:21-22 1 Jo. 1:8-10

IV. Concluding applications.

- A. Joseph exemplifies these principles as he forgives his brothers. Gen. 45:11 50:15-21
- B. We who have been forgiven by God's grace are empowered to forgive.
- C. Have you experienced the forgiveness of your 10,000 talent debt?
