PHASE 1—WHY FAITH?

- In Romans 1–3 Paul explains that...
- All sinners face God's wrath (1:18), whether irreligious sinners (ch. 1) or very religious sinners (ch. 2).
- Every human is unrighteous (3:9-10), and no one can do enough good to make God clear their guilt (3:20).
- The only way anyone can be cleared of guilt is if God gives them righteousness (3:22) through faith in Jesus's sacrifice (3:25-26).


PHASE 2—WHAT IS FAITH?

In Romans 4 Paul teaches that...

- God credits sinners (like Abraham and David) with righteousness on the basis of their faith, not on the basis of their works.
- In verses 18-21 Paul defines faith as persevering conviction in God's promises about the blessings that will come to the world through Abraham's offspring.

God justifies everyone who trusts in Jesus.
