Prayer of Adoration

Great are You, O Lord, and exceedingly worthy of praise; Your power is immense, and Your wisdom beyond reckoning. Reading responsively, let us confess the Law of our God.

Reading of the Law: Matthew 25:35-40

A lawyer [of the Pharisees] asked [Jesus] a question, testing Him, and saying, "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him,

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind'. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

Confession of Sin

Merciful God, we humble ourselves in Your presence, confessing our unworthiness and our sinfulness in Your sight. We have broken Your holy law. Most Gracious God, our heavenly Father, who has given Your Son, Jesus Christ, to save Your people from their sins; forgive us, we beseech You. Cleanse us from all unrighteousness and renew a right spirit within us; through the grace of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Amen

Assurance of Pardon

Let us love You Lord, and give thanks to You and confess Your Name, because You have forgiven our grave sins and wicked deeds through Jesus Christ, Your Son. By Your sheer grace and mercy in Him You melted our sins away like ice. To Your grace we also ascribe whatever sins we have not committed, for what would we not have been capable of, we who could be enamored with any wanton crime? We acknowledge that You have delivered us in everything: from both the sins we willingly committed following our own wills, and those we avoided through Your guidance. *Amen.*

Psalter: Psalm 9:11-20, "Immortal, Invisible"

Sing praise to the Lord, Who in Zion does dwell; Among all the peoples His great doings tell. When blood He avenges, His mem'ry is clear; The cry of the poor never fades from His ear.

Lord, see what I suffer from malice and hate; Have mercy! O lift me away from death's gate, That I with the daughter of Zion may voice Your praises, and in Your salvation rejoice.

The Lord's Supper

Hear the words of the Holy Gospel, taken from Saint Matthew: "As they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body". Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins". Now, in Christ's Name, I take

these elements, the bread and the wine, to be set apart by prayer and thanksgiving to the holy use for which He has appointed them. Let us pray:

O God, You have, by the blood of Your dear Son, set apart for us a new and a living way into the Holiest of All. Cleanse our minds, we implore You by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit that, drawing near unto You with a pure heart and undefiled conscience, we may receive these, Your gifts, without sin, and worthily magnify Your holy name through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The bread, which we break is, by faith, a participation in the Body of Christ. In just like manner, the cup that we bless is, by faith, a participation in the Blood of Christ.

Closing Prayer

Most merciful God, we bless Your holy Name for all Your servants who have kept the faith, and, having accomplished their warfare, are at rest with You. We pray that You will enable us to follow their good example. May we, with them, finally be partakers of Your heavenly kingdom. May we at the glorious appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, behold Him with unveiled face, being changed into His likeness when He will present us, with all His Church, faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy. Hear us, O heavenly Father, for His sake to whom, with You and the Holy Spirit, glory is given forever and ever. *Amen.*
