In the Lord I Put My Trust Psalm 11

Main Point:

Through Jesus Christ, you are always in God's gracious favor; therefore, when you're tempted to flee, put your trust in Him.

1. When you're tempted to flee in times of trial, trust God.

2. Trust God in your times of trial because He's still in charge.

3. Trust God in your times of trial because He's only testing you.

- 4. Trust God in your times of trial because He will ensure that justice is served.
- 5. Trust God in your times of trial because you're in His gracious favor through Jesus Christ.

Romans 8:28 ²⁸ And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to *His* purpose. (NKJV)

James 1:2-4 ² My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, ³ knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. ⁴ But let patience have *its* perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing. (NKJV)
