SERMON **Prayer: The Power of a Vital Church** Dr. Chris Walker #1 in a Morning Sermon Series for the New Year—Three Pillars of a Healthy Church

Beneath the Cross of Jesus #251

- 1. Beneath the cross of Jesus I fain would take my stand, the shadow of a mighty Rock within a weary land; a home within the wilderness, a rest upon the way, from the burning of the noontide heat and the burden of the day.
- 2. Upon the cross of Jesus mine eye at times can see the very dying form of One who suffered there for me: and from my stricken heart with tears two wonders I confess, the wonders of redeeming love and my unworthiness.
