- Certain times and circumstances more susceptible to attacks

Terror Alert?

- A. In the midst of a "Spiritual High" -- Luke 4:1
- B. When we are being "led by the Spirit"-- Luke 4:1
 - 1. How can we be led by the Spirit into temptation?
 - 2. Two-sided Nature of Temptation
 - a. Satan-- solicitation for evil
 - b. God-- to prove or improve our faith and character
- C. "In the wilderness"-- that is, when alone.-- Luke 4:1
 - 1. Traditional location of the wilderness
 - 2. God testing of the nation of Israel in the wilderness—Deut. 8:2
 - 3. Mistakenly think that isolation is the answer to temptation.
 - 4. God's presence assures that we are never alone.
 - 5. God sees what we do in secret.
- D. "Under a long siege"-- Luke 4:2
 - 1. Temptation lasted 40 days.
 - 2. Significance of the 40 days?
 - 3. The Effects of a long siege-- wear down our resistance to temptation4. Illustration: Job
- E. In the "presence of bad dudes"-- Luke 4:2
 - 1. The Devil as the "Ultimate bad dude"
 - a. His fall from his exalted position—Ezek. 28 and Isa 14
 - b. His demonic empire-- Ephesians 6:12
 - 2. Why does the devil attempt the impossible in tempting Jesus?

 - a. Pride blinds him to reality.b. His threshold of success was low in comparison to the stakes which were extremely high.
 - 3. "Evil company corrupts good habits."
 - a. Individually-- Proverbs 13:20
 - b. Culturally-- 2 Peter 2:7-8
