Proverbs on Wealth and Poverty

Wisdom is an attentiveness to God's Word, God's character, and God's created order in order to live life knowledgably and well as God intended it to be lived.

The Roots of Wealth & Poverty

- 6:10-11 A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man.
 - 10:4 A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich.
 - 14:23 In all toil there is profit, but mere talk tends only to poverty.
 - 28:19 Whoever works his land will have plenty of bread, but he who follows worthless pursuits will have plenty of poverty.

Practical Wisdom & Warnings

- 13:11 Wealth gained hastily will dwindle, but whoever gathers little by little will increase it.
- 11:24 One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want.
- 14:31 Whoever oppresses a poor man insults his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him.
- 22:7 The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is the slave of the lender.

The End of Money

- 11:4 Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death.
- 11:28 Whoever trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like a green leaf.
- 15:16 Better is a little with the fear of the LORD than great treasure and trouble with it.
- 22:1 A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold.
- 22:2 The rich and the poor meet together; the LORD is the maker of them all.
- 28:6 Better is a poor man who walks in his integrity than a rich man who is crooked in his ways.
- 30:8b (NIV) Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread.
