Proverbs teaches God's sovereign control of all things, human responsibility under God's sovereignty, and even all evil under God's rule and for his ultimate, good purposes.

15:29 The LORD is far from the wicked, but he hears the prayer of the righteous. The plans of the heart belong to man, but the answer of the tongue is 16:1 from the LORD. All the ways of a man are pure in his own eyes, but the LORD weighs the 16:2 spirit. 16:3 Commit your work to the LORD, and your plans will be established. The LORD has made everything for its purpose, even the wicked for the 16:4 day of trouble. The heart of man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps. 16:9 16:33 The lot is cast into the lap, but its every decision is from the LORD. Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the 19:21 LORD that will stand. 20:12 The hearing ear and the seeing eye, the LORD has made them both. A man's steps are from the LORD; how then can man understand his 20:24 way? The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the LORD; he turns it 21:1 wherever he will. 21:30 No wisdom, no understanding, no counsel can avail against the LORD. The horse is made ready for the day of battle, but the victory belongs to 21:31 the LORD. Fret not yourself because of evildoers, and be not envious of the 24:19-20 wicked, for the evil man has no future; the lamp of the wicked will be put out. Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may 27:1 bring.
