## Life in God's Family 1 Thess. 5:12-15

#### Introduction

- 1. Doctrinal precision and speculative theology are the rage. Doctrine is important, theology is important, but sometimes when we exalt doctrine, we discount ethics.
- 2. There is no way to separate doctrine from ethics in Scripture. Although they are not the same, they are inextricably bound. How we treat each other, how we minister to each other, matters.
- 3. But life in God's family can challenging.
  - 4. Paul has already provided a model of ministry to us (2:7-12)
- 5. Paul is now going to give specific instruction to living with family members in the body.

- B. Admonish the disorderly
- C. Comfort the faint-hearted
- D. Stand by the weak
- E. Be patient with all
