Memory verse:

Ephesians 6:4 (NKJ)And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.

Ephesians 6:4 (NIV) Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

[Rated PG] That means to raise them right parental guidance is required not just suggested.

Face the Facts:

- Your kids lack **experience** Deuteronomy 11:1-2
- Your kids learn by your <u>example</u> Deuteronomy 11:18-19
- Your kids long for your **involvement**. Deuteronomy 11:19-21

Why is this so important?

- 1) When it matters the most the <u>quality</u> of the relationship with your children will determine the <u>weight</u> of your influence in your son/daughter's life.
- 2) The relationship you have with your child is what **sets them up** for all future relationships. An investment in the relationship with your child now is like an investment in **all of his/her** future relationships.

What to do while there is time:

- Unconditional acceptance
- Uninterrupted **time**

What to do if you have blown it:

- <u>Pray</u> no one is beyond the reach of God's power
- Serve it is difficult to continually reject humble service
- Love unconditional love is hard to ignore
