

## 4. The guilt of all humanity before God

- rejecting actual knowledge of God (1:18-20)
  - + general v. special revelation
  - + mediate v. immediate general revelation Ps. 19:1-4; Isa. 6:3; Acts 14:14-17 Rom. 2:14-15

- how man rejects God (1:21)
  - a. fails to glorify God
  - b. fails to give thanks to God
  - c. builds his life and thinking on futile speculations
  - d. darkness fills his being
- the first result of rejecting God: idolatry (1:22-23)
