## A change in:

I. Strategy – "if it make you answer of peace" (vs. 10-15)

 $An\ appreciation\ for:$ 

- A. Peace "proclaim peace unto it"
- B. Partners "the people found therein shall be tributaries"
- C. Potential "but the women and little ones...take unto thyself"
- **II.** Separation "which they have done unto their gods" (vs.16-18) *An awareness of*:
  - A. Commands "as the Lord thy God has commanded you"
  - B. Contamination "teach you not to do after...their abomination"
  - C. Compromise "so should you sin against the Lord your God"
- III. Sustainability —"thou shall not cut them down" (vs. 19-20)

  An approach that is:
- A. Patient "When thou shall besiege a city a long time"
- B. Practical "for thou mayest eat of them"
- C. Protective "thou shall build bulwarks against the city"
