Today: A comparison of Is 52:12 - 53:13 and Psalm 22

- Is 52:12 53:13 is the fourth Servant Song describing the suffering and death of the Servant to free God's people from bondage to sin.
- Psalm 22 speaks of the suffering of the Messiah and the glories to follow
- Dan points out that Isaiah here provides a commentary on Ps 22. Today we will look at that in detail.

## Isaiah

53:5-6 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

- Took the punishment for our sins
- Reconciled us with God
- Brought us healing
- Bore the sins of all men

## Ps 22

- V22-24 I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:
   23 You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him, and stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!
  - 24 For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.
    - Brothers...you who fear the Lord...offspring of Israel
      - Speaking to those saved
    - praise him! ...glorify him, and stand in awe of him,
      - Praising God for His wonderful work of salvation
    - he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted.
      - Those lost in sin
    - and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.
      - Has saved them

- 53:11 Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.
  - Question about whether the pronouns refer to the Father or to the Son.
  - Answer from Dan: The ESV is fairly literal. "The Righteous One, My Servant" is said from the Father's perspective, and all the other third-persons refer to the Son. So it starts out very literally From the trouble of His soul He will see, He will be satisfied; by His knowledge He will declare-righteous the Righteous One, My Servant the many; and their iniquities He Himself will bear. The "He" in all those is most naturally the same person, the Son.

<ul> <li>53:12 Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong,</li> <li>The many (believers) are apportioned as His people.</li> <li>The strong (enemies) are apportioned as His spoil</li> </ul>	V21-22You have rescued me from the horns of the wild oxen! 22 I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:  The many are the congregation of brothers  He lives, so the strong are no more.
