4. Because only Jesus can give us what we need.

Benjamin Shaw "In this investigation, as in the others in which he engages, Solomon remains objective. In other words, he does not devote himself to pleasure without reservation. Instead, he maintains, as it were, a mental objectivity, like the doctor examining the progress of his own disease."

Philip Ryken "Whenever he spied something he wanted, he took it. Whenever he was tempted to indulge in a fleshly pleasure, he did so. There was nothing he denied himself - nothing 'visibly entertaining or inwardly satisfying'."

Philip Ryken "If all the pleasures under the sun cannot satisfy our souls, then we need to look beyond this world to God in Heaven."
