### **Singular Salvation**

- 1. What is our first cause for thanksgiving according to v. 1?
- 2. What can possibly turn God's anger away?
- 3. Read Romans 3:22b-25a and 1 John 4:10. What does "propitiation" mean?
- 4. What is the result of God's wrath "turned away?"
- 5. Who will give thanks?
- 6. "God [Himself] is my salvation." Do we ever act as if something else is our salvation?
- 7. What are the positive and negative actions of faith according to verse 2?
- 8. LORD GOD is literally "Yah Yahweh." Yah is the diminutive form of Yahweh and may express endearment. Why did Isaiah give this name for God here?
- 9. Read Exodus 15:2. Describe the context of Moses singing this and relate it to "my strength and my song."
- 10. How is God YOUR strength and song?

#### **Communal Proclamation**

- 2. What is the common joy of the community?
