They will announce God's saving work—"his saving (delivering) righteousness" (BDB 842), "saving deeds" (NET), "justness of the divine judge ... as action which rescues, sets to right" (HALOT 1006).

D. Posterity will P______ to the Future Generations the Lord's Success— 22:31b

1. They will declare that He worked, accomplished and f_____ (righteousness = salvation).

→ Note: The Psalm <u>ends with two simple Hebrew words</u> translated, <u>"that He has done."</u>

→ Translations:

"They will come and will declare His righteousness to a people who will be born, that He has performed it" (NASV).

"they shall come and proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn, that he has done it" (ESV).

"They will tell people yet to be born about his righteousness-that he has finished it" (GWN).

- 2. They will say something very similar to what Jesus said when hanging on the cross, "IT IS FINISHED!" (John 19:30).
- → QUOTE: "The saved people who enter the kingdom age will build houses, plant vineyards and rear children (Isa. 65:17-25). These saved people will tell the story of Psalm 22 to the people—the children that shall be born, 'that he hath done this.' Do not overlook the facts of the Psalm, that the Messiah suffered on the earth, was crucified, died and was resurrected, all for the salvation of sinful men. This is the gospel—the good news of the New Testament. This same gospel will be preached during the kingdom age (known as the Millennium)"(O.E. Phillips, Exploring the Messianic Psalms, p. 78).
