Um, and then the Furnishing the supply of all of these things and Uh, in vers. 10. 83. Uh, and then he's also provided especially now for the transportation. Of the Tabernacle as well, which they're going to need because they are on the move. Uh but God as it were or The Nearness of God to them as he has designed for them to experience and know his nearness is is going to go with them, not just in the cloud and the fire and we'll hear about that.

And In the forthcoming chapters. But the Tent of meeting the Tabernacle of God is going to go with them and so gershon apparently. The items that the gershonites are going to be carrying, only need the two carts, and the four oxen. And, Uh, that which the mirror writes, you remember, Uh, are carrying.

And that's the more structural, you know, the bigger structural pieces. And so they receive four carts and eight oxen, but why didn't the coetides receive anything? Why didn't they receive any carts or oxen for helping them carry their part. Well, it was because they had been given the task of carrying the holy things.

In fact, they weren't even allowed to watch the holy things. Be packed up. You remember, Eleazar? Would have to do all of that covering. And then when it was ready and the polls were already inserted and everything was covered, then he would come and he would tell the coetides, you can carry it now.

And we know very famously when this was not done. You remember the incident with Aza and the Ark and how he touched it, because it was on a cart being being pulled by oxen and it was tottering and it was going to fall on the ground and he thought I'm sure that he was Um, that he was doing the right thing by reaching out to touch the ark.

Well, the coetides didn't need oxen and they didn't need carts, they needed obedience. And probably a fair bit of muscle. In order to carry their items by the polls but you see here, God pulls from different times. He pulls all these things together. Not so that later. Um, men, who in their resistance, to the truth of the word of God can rebelliously say, aha.

See, there are things here that are out of order. We knew there were mistakes in the Bible. No, it is not mistake in the Bible. It is God calling our attention to the themes. The the theme that pulls all these things together, the great provision of his dwelling with men of his worship, by which we may draw near to him and even greater.

Now for us now that we know that the Tabernacle was a shadow of Christ and the priesthood anticipated Christ, and the sacrifices anticipated Christ, and that it is in the Lord Jesus, that God has given us to draw near to him. And he's atoned for our sin and he's made us to ascend and be seated within in the Heavenly places.

And when we come, we come not with with grain or incense in hand, but we come with Jesus in hand as it were in the hand of faith. In this chapter in this portion is the the consecration Transportation Furnishing of the Tabernacle service and how the great thing. About God's people is The Nearness of God to them, even later.

And in Deuteronomy and Moses's last sermon, which Lord sparing us. Will be in not too long from now. Uh he says that one of the reasons that God gave them good laws to obey was so that others who saw Israel and saw their good laws And as far as we know, this really did not happen in the history of Israel.

This is happening, especially among those Believers who are conformed to Christ. Christ is the true Israel, but so that others would would see the good laws and say what, uh, people that have such good laws, who is like them, who have a god, so near What a blessing. To be the people of God, redeemed reconciled to him in Jesus Christ, and to be brought so near.

We ought not in the weakness of our faith and our desire for more sensory worship and experiences. We ought not go back to observing Jewish beasts and festivals or infesting the worship with with Jewish things. But we should see the great mercy of God, to give his people

then a way of drawing near and the greater mercy of God that he has given us in our day, in our age with Christ.

The priest having offered the sacrifice and being the reality in glory of which the Tabernacle was a shadow. You are a people dear Church. To God and how we should Revel in that and rejoice in that Marvel at it. Wonder before God at the greatness of his Mercy to us and in.

So doing one of the things that we will want to do is Embrace God's order for his church submit to God's order for his church. Notice again. I've already mentioned that each of these 12 leaders was specifically designated by God. They were not elected by the people as far as we can tell.

When When the census was taken earlier, the Lord named whom he wanted to be. The leader. Of each of the tribes, and it was the Lord who had arranged The tribes of Israel as he wanted them. God was the one who would would make you to be born in either Asher or naftali or Judah, or whatever it is or if you were one of these mixed multitude, remember in Exodus chapter 12 in a mixed multitude.

Came up with them and they could not take the the Passover unless They became members of of Israelite households. And so in, God's Providence, whatever household, one of them had come into and been circumcised and joined so that they could participate in the taking of the path that also wasn't God's Providence.

Even though there would have been a little more human agency involved and yet it is God's Providence with whom you come into contact. If you grew up outside of the church and God brought you to Faith, he's the one who very carefully, oversaw? How, how you he would bring you to that point in your life.

And some of us have been in, maybe we grew up in a, a mega church in Michigan. Yes. Such things existed in the 80s or I think maybe there was just the one. It was in the Lord's Providence that that he has brought you to himself and brought you along the path that he has.

It's in his God, it's in his Providence. Now that you're at Hopewell that you're gathered un worshiping him. This is one of the reasons why First Corinthians 12 teaches us not to say because well, you know, I'm kind of different from the rest of the Hopewellians. I guess. I'm not that much of a part uh that much a part of the body.

First Corinthians. 12 also says, you know, we shouldn't look at anybody who Whom the Lord has made part of our our church, a member of this congregation. And so, you know, they're kind of different than uh than I am. They're not a part of the body now, First Corinthians 12 says God has arranged the members of the body just as pleases him, Justice seems good, uh, to him and so, Very similarly here you have the 12 tribes, you have a divinely appointed leadership.

You have the divinely arranged tribes and the Lord drives home to them, their personal tribal identity. The. The, the language when it says, Sorry, I didn't put the The text reference. The outline. There you go, verse 11. Where it says they shall offer their offering one leader. Each day for the dedication of the altar.

It's actually a repeated phrase in the Hebrew, what's translated there, one leader. Each day is one leader, one day, one leader, one day. And you can, you can even hear a little bit saying it that way and hearing it that way. Uh, that the the Lord wanted each tribe with its leader that it received as assigned to to them.

By the Lord and that leader was a sinner and I'm sure there are many things he said or did that. That if you were in his tribe, you would not have said it that way, or done it that way or could have bothered you but you'd receive him as God's appointment for you.

And he was the one who appointed, the leaders. He was the one who had arranged the tribes. And whereas, Whereas, for us, we're not from one of these 12 tribes. Uh, so it may seem a little tedious to us. To read 72 verses worth of 12 days and six verses a day and each one of them the same and God forgive us, it's from our flesh.

That would ever make The reading of God's word. To seem tedious. But what uh, you can imagine how for them. Whatever day was their tribe's day, they would be very excited for and you know what else they might have been excited for their lamb. The that was brought up in their house or maybe the silver platter that they had given up some earrings that they had gotten from From their Egyptian neighbor during The Exodus or or whatever it was, because we mustn't think, especially with the amount that was given by each tribe, that was brought near by the leader that it was given just by that leader.

Each one of these tribes. And especially if you were from a smaller tribe, your family is a portion that you had to give in order for your tribe to come up with the same amount would actually be bigger, wouldn't it? And so, there's not just the, uh, the appointment of the leadership and the arrangement of his, uh, of his people into the divisions where he had placed each one of them.

Uh, there's also implied here, uh, divinely assigned Providence and individual participation. Uh, that you would participate in that part of God's people and whatever your little part was contributing it, it was assigned to you by God. It came to you in his Providence. So that when you finally read the Uh, the sum totals Uh in verses 84 through 88, you get there through Those 72 verses.

Uh, 72 verses worth of the 12 days. The one of each tribe and you see what the Lord is is doing here. He's showing us to in just a small way. The cumulative effect of small things. So, literally millions of Israelites, And giving a little bit and arranged into their 12 tribes and then each of the tribes giving their portion and the silver and the total of the the silver from the platters and the bowls, and the gold and the total of the the total number of shackles of gold and And the oxen for the Ascension and

Sorry, the the oxen, uh, for and the Rams.

And mail Lambs for the Ascension and the grain offering and kids of the goats. For the sin offering. And so forth, all of this. Uh, was such a huge amount by the time you get to verses 84 through 88 but it was accumulated. By small amounts. And this is something that the Lord teaches us in his word is not to despise the day of small things that we wouldn't disregard.

How significant is the accumulation of what God does through the individuals of his people. And even. Through what he what he does. Slowly but surely persistency persistently in our life. Uh for us, the accumulation feels primarily, like a big long reading. We don't get to see the the total up there, when it's all done at the end of the 12th day, and all the platters, and all the bowls, and all the oxen, and the kids of the goats, and the Rams and the male lambs and and and then the bigger.

A group of those of those animals that was brought near. That are going to be sacrificed for the peace offerings that we get to eat from and have a great big. A great big Feast. From the peace offerings. But you, they got By the Lord's arrangement and the Lord's accumulating.

These small things. Uh, you know, this is an encouragement on the one hand, if If you are discouraged with your growth, Uh, in your life. And perhaps you don't attend upon the means of Grace because you don't feel like it makes much of a difference. Well, the Lord is the one who has given it to you to do and he's the one who makes it to make a difference.

And it's his ordinary way of accumulating much. From many small things. So one, you know, line word, upon word line upon line day, upon Day upon day and the cumulative effect of how the Lord grows you. Some of you have had this This experience and in other parts of your life, perhaps you've had this experience.

Um since you have been participating with Hopewell that the the steady plotting through the word of God. The steady experience of God day by day in the family Worship and the secret worship as as you pray day by day and as you sing day by day and the knowledge of God the cumulative effect of what he does is great, even if Any days worth this small.

And what a great work. He does in the life of a child parenting can be very frustrating. Our children are sinners and even worse. They're Sinners, because we are sinners. And because they, they came from us. And the progress sometimes feels small or even negative. Uh sometimes we see something that we thought was progress and then there's backsliding or things do not turn out to be spiritually what we thought they had been and it's very easy.

To become discouraged if we don't learn this lesson. Of the great cumulative effect. Of how God has arranged to work in his people. And in our children and then we think of Generations. Especially.

If I can make a personal application here that also has application to you, You know, this church. 1 40th, or 50th the size. Of the church that I grew up in. Um, but we see what the Lord does in his people even like in Isaiah 51. This morning, he says, Remember.

Uh The Rock from which you were hearing, Abraham was just one man in Hebrews 11 says and as good as debt and Remember the, the hole the pit out of which you you were dug, you know, just out of Sarah's womb. Came the eventually the the nation of Israel.

And, It is a joy to minister to the Lord whether as the pastor in the pulpit or as those who are admonishing one, another in Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, and the pews, and worshiping separately in our homes throughout the week and sometimes together during the week. And and often regularly together on the Lord's day and and knowing that not only is the Lord using us and one another's lives.

Generations, multiply Uh, from among the faithful that scripture teaches us to look uh, to look to him for. And may your tribes increase. Uh, God grants that uh, that there would be millions. That Israel was smaller than hope. Well, when it went down to Egypt, And now look at what the Lord even just does just in raw numbers.

By Numbers chapter 7. Uh but thinking about that, especially with application to what he is doing, spiritually in the knowledge of God and drawing near to God and growth in the grace of Jesus Christ. And some of you have seen What the Lord has given your children by his Mercy, not by our greatness and are having figured it out.

Certainly not by the greatness of our faithfulness or our children would have all unraveled a hundred times over by now. But by his Mercy he is given to many of our children. What we Look back and we Marvel at the difference. And yet God has mercifully and perfectly attended to us as well.

But a little bit closer final application. Uh, what he what he gives in this chapter. That each of you would take. Seriously the part that he's given you in his worship. Um, it is amazing. Uh, To participate in hundreds or thousands. Of people singing. Uh, the the Psalms accompanied by nothing but the grace of the Holy Spirit in the in the hearts of the people.

Uh, but there is no one person who sings For hundreds or thousands, each one provides their own voice. Each, one of you is assigned by God. A part that the accumulate, the cumulative effect is great. And one day, it'll, it'll be in a multitude that no one can number.

So, also, when you are worshiping God and we don't we don't bring near now. Do we bulls and goats, and Rams, and Use a little grain, but we don't bring the the, the grain near And so forth. But when we come, we offer ourselves our souls a spiritual sacrifice unto God.

We offer the sacrifice of Thanksgiving and the sacrifice of Praise like we heard in Psalm 116 this morning, we offer the crying out of our heart, and dependence upon Jesus and delighting in him. And although you cannot see or hear it, the way we can hear the cumulative effect of the voices.

Is it not still the worship of God? And so every one of your parts when we gather for the public worship, every one of your parts, lifting up your heart, to the Lord, and the calling upon his name from your soul, and the offering yourself and praise and Thanksgiving is accumulating in Jesus Christ presented by him.

Our great appointed leader, our great high priest, our Tabernacle and brought near So do not despise or treat as small, your voice in the singing, your heart, and mind in the reading and the praying. And when you offer the listening to his word and you're submitting yourself to his word and receiving it and and looking by the grace of the Holy Spirit, to be convinced of what he teaches and committed to what he commands.

All of that is accumulated in Christ and it is great, indeed in him. Indeed. The great thing about the church is her God. And her God and Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. But he gives each individual that is in him. A part. In that cumulative. That is marvelous and impressive.

When it is completed. So the Lord Uh, give us to remember that. Not just about Israel in number seven. But Hopewell in 2024. And that great multitude in glory with whom we will be Locally gathered one day. Um, will not be satellite congregations of Heaven forever. Amen, let's pray.

We thank you Lord for these. 88 verses we thank you. For what you did for Israel. Uh, we are Uh, warned. Since we have similar original sin to theirs. Um, That we could be like, Um, and forget the greatness of what you had done. For them. As they did, especially Lord, since you have given us to live in the age of Christ's own priesthood, And so there is that greaterness.

Of what you have given to us. In our day, let us not despise it. Let us not be negligent or treat a small or be lazy or easily give up. Uh the participation that you have so honored us to have in the whole of the worship that is offered through Christ, but glorify him not only in his church corporately.

But in the heart and mind and mouth and life. Of each one of his members specifically we ask. In his name. Amen.
