WLC Q. 113: What are the sins forbidden in the third commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the third commandment are, the not using of God's name as is required; and the abuse of it in an ignorant, vain, irreverent, profane, superstitious or wicked mentioning or otherwise using his titles, attributes, ordinances, or works, by blasphemy, perjury; all sinful cursings, oaths, vows, and lots; violating of our oaths and vows, if lawful and fulfilling them, if of things unlawful (1 Sam. 25); murmuring and quarrelling at, curious prying into, and misapplying of God's decrees and providences... WCF, 22 Of lawful oaths and vows, 4. An oath is to be taken in the plain and common sense of the words, without equivocation, or mental reservation. It cannot oblige to sin; but in any thing not sinful, being taken, it binds to performance, although to a man's own hurt (1 Sam. 25:22, 32–34, Ps. 15:4)...
