







- Abraham had been <u>physically</u> dead nearly 2,000 years
- Impossible for Jesus to <u>physically</u> know Abraham

Christ makes statement of deity: I Am {έγὼ εἰμί}

- He directly identifies Himself with God (God's Son)
- If not true then He sinned; unworthy as Pascal Lamb
- Jews seek to stone Him for blasphemy

Christ Leaves the Temple

- Christ looses Himself in the crowds evading pious Jews
 - Easily accomplished in the cacophony of the thousands in the Temple
 - This ends their dialogue; but, not our analysis
- John arranged his narrative around three amen, amen or truly, truly {Absolute truth} statements

Amen, Amen Statements

Lucifer to \$240

- Everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin
- Slave does not stay in the house forever
- Lucifer first sinner {Not-God} {All sin is not-God}
- All who believe Christ will never taste death

Christ de 850

- If Son sets you free you are truly free, from sin
- (ἀμήν, ἀμήν) Son is God, in the house, family, forever 02.659

Underlying Assumptions Nothing new under the sun; same sin and temptations (Ec 1/940) 1Co 10:130 Thus sin and temptations preceded creation Ergo, sin's beginning was before man 0 Lucifer is the first sinner in eternity past before creation 0 Remember, Heaven is outside of time Unless given a time correlation, events difficult to place New Covenant Salvation Planned God's salvation began before this creation @r 1.340 ○ The call, "Who is worthy...?" was in Heaven, outside of time, in eternity past' {Law of Logical Inferences} 04/5140 No one was worthy <u>implies</u> someone tried to be worthy Some created being believed himself equal to be as God 0 Rejected, as he was not God, unable to atone for sin Looking at Lucifer's Fall Again Lucifer reflected God's glory; however, he was a cherub, a ministering spirit of God (2251415,06110) The call, "Who is worthy," goes out and Lucifer answers 0 (1+13-15) His opportunity to show himself worthy to open the scroll; except, only God is worthy; and God's Son His pride rebelled, separating him from God eternally; 0 his sin ignites violence, rebellion: angels & man (Er 18-16-17, Br 12-4-12)
