The Heidelberg Catechism

LORD'S DAY 41

108. Q. What does the seventh commandment teach us?

A. That all unchastity is cursed by God. We must therefore detest it from the heart and live chaste and disciplined lives, both within and outside of holy marriage.

109. Q. Does God in this commandment forbid nothing more than adultery and similar shameful sins?

A. Since we, body and soul, are temples of the Holy Spirit, it is God's will that we keep ourselves pure and holy. Therefore He forbids all unchaste acts, gestures, words, thoughts, desires, and whatever may entice us to unchastity.



Questions for discussion

1. What two specific purposes did it serve for God to allow the Jews to stumble and be hardened so that they fell? What roll did the Gentiles play in this process?
2. What is God's intentions towards the Jews?
3. What does the "fullness of the Jews" mean? What happens when the fullness of the Jews comes?
4. When God grafts Jews back into their own olive tree, what does that mean?
5. What is the "reconciliation" that is referred to that resulted from the falling away of the Jews? What was so great about it?
6. What is the comparison spoken of in this passage?
7. The word "world" means different things in Scripture. In this passage, we see God reconciling the *world* to Himself (cf 2 Cor. 5:19). And yet in John 17:9 Christ said "*I pray not for the world*" and in the Apostle John writes in 1 John 2:15, "*love not the world*"? How are you to be able to tell the difference between the world that Christ prayed for and God loves; and the world that God hates and Christ refused to pray for?
8. What is the difference between "resurrection" and "the life out of resurrection"?
