#### **EXPOSITION OF ROMANS**

Message #12 Romans 3:9-20

One of the real problems of our day is that not too many will admit condemnatory <u>sin</u>, and there is a rift of people in society who will tell us it isn't <u>our</u> fault. Dr. John MacArthur said: "Men like to believe they are basically <u>good</u> and that belief is continually reinforced by psychologists, counselors, and a great many religious leaders" (*Romans*, Vol. 1, p. 177).

If we were to stop people in the streets and ask them, "How do you think <u>God</u> views human beings?" I am certain we would hear some interesting answers. Some would say - "God is a <u>loving</u> God and He knows men do the best they can." Some would say - "God <u>sees</u> the bad things, but in the end He will just overlook them and everyone will live happily ever after." Some would say - "God <u>knows</u> no one is perfect, we have all made mistakes, but in the end everything will be fine."

Unfortunately, this type of view is not <u>Biblical</u>! God does not <u>see</u> mankind this way. **Even though most do not want to admit it, the truth is all are <u>guilty</u> in His estimation and <u>deserve</u> His wrath.** 

# EVERY HUMAN BEING IS <u>GUILTY</u> BEFORE GOD, AND APART FROM FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST HE WILL BE JUSTLY CONDEMNED BY GOD.

This is precisely the point of **verse 9**. All humanity is <u>sinful</u>. If a person has not trusted in Jesus Christ for salvation, he is <u>lost</u>. He is not good; he is <u>doomed</u>.

**REASON #1** – All humanity is guilty and will be condemned because of <u>God's</u> view of <u>man</u>. **3:10-12** 

In these verses, Paul gives us six glimpses of <u>man's</u> status from <u>God's</u> perspective.

## Glimpse #1 - Man is not righteous . 3:10

I want you to notice how **verse 10** begins "as it is written." This is God's written, undebatable, observable classification of man. It is in print for us to clearly see.

God's view of man is "there is <u>none</u> righteous." The idea of being "righteous" is the idea of being right according to the <u>standard</u> of God. According to God's Word, there is no one who <u>meets</u> His righteous standard. There is no one who measures up - not even <u>one</u>.

This picture God has of man is not <u>new</u>. In fact, Paul is quoting Psalm <u>14:1-3</u> and Psalm <u>53:1-3</u>. There has never been any person who measured up to the righteous standards of God.

# <u>Glimpse #2</u> - Man is not <u>understanding</u>. **3:11a**

The word "understanding" is one that means to <u>know</u> something or <u>perceive</u> something. To have a <u>true</u> mental perception. What Paul is saying is that not one person has, in and of himself, a <u>proper</u> mental perception about God and His method of righteousness. **Lost people do not have a proper view and perception of God.** 

### Glimpse #3 - Man does not seek God . 3:11b

The idea of one who "seeks for God" is the idea of <u>searching</u> for a relationship with God that is proper in light of who God is and what God says. Sinful man does not <u>seek</u> God. He does not, in and of himself, <u>search</u> for a proper relationship with God. It is natural for a person to want God on <u>his</u> terms; it is not natural for a person to seek God on <u>God's</u> terms. This is clearly seen in the aftermath of man's first sin. It wasn't Adam and Eve who went seeking God, it was God who sought them (Genesis 3:8-10). When Adam sinned he didn't run to God; he ran away from God and man has been running from God ever since.

# Glimpse #4 - Man does not move <u>right</u>. 3:12a

According to God's way of righteousness, no man moves in the <u>right</u> direction. All have "<u>turned</u> aside." Donald Gray Barnhouse said you may easily prove this point by observing that most people do not like careful teaching of God's Word and doctrines, which proves most people are not really interested in moving in a right direction.

Isaiah the prophet said - "All of us are like sheep who have gone <u>astray</u>, we have all <u>turned</u> to his own way" (Isaiah 53:6).

The verb "turn aside" carries with it the idea of turning <u>from</u> what is right in God's view to what is evil (G. Abbott-Smith, p. 139). Every human being has turned from the <u>right</u> path to the <u>wrong</u> path. This is <u>God's</u> personal evaluation of every human being.

## Glimpse #5 - Man becomes useless . 3:12b

The Hebrew equivalent of this Greek word describes a milk that was so sour and spoiled that you could not use it for drinking.

The verb "have become useless" is a <u>passive</u> verb. What this means is that regardless of what man has done, he is <u>made</u> useless to the mind of God. One who tries to be right with God on his own is one whom God <u>views</u> as useless. His efforts mean <u>nothing</u> to God.

The passive verb clearly indicates that a person is useless, not by his own <u>action</u>, but by <u>classification</u> of God if he does not trust Jesus Christ for salvation.

<u>Glimpse #6</u> - Man is not <u>good</u>. **3:12c** 

Total Depravity does not mean there is not <u>some</u> good in a human; it means there is no good in a human that can <u>satisfy</u> God.

There is not even one human being in the entire world <u>good</u> enough to be right with God in and of himself. Solomon said: "For there is not a <u>just</u> man upon earth, that doeth good and sinneth not" (Ecclesiastes 7:20).

**REASON #2** – All humanity is guilty and will be condemned because of <u>man's</u> own works. **3:13-18** 

There are two specific works mentioned here:

Work #1 - Man has sinned with his speech. 3:13-14

One of the great proofs that God's picture of man is accurate is what comes out of his <u>mouth</u>. Our lips have revealed our <u>depravity</u>.

None of us are <u>innocent</u> when it comes to the things we have <u>said</u>.

Speech is a real <u>proof</u> of what is happening in one's <u>heart</u>. No wonder James says the mark of real spiritual depth is to <u>control</u> one's speech (James 3:2).

Work #2 - Man has sinned with his <u>actions</u>. 3:15-18

Lost man <u>acts</u> lost. Man does not fear God - he will do miserable, destructive things <u>contrary</u> to the Word of God.

Read the history of this country how we went to the Indian territories and killed the Indians and took their land. Read the history of how white men went to Africa and stole natives and sold them like a piece of meat. Look at the barons of this country who fatten their pocketbooks because of their greed, while poor working people try to find a job to provide food, clothing, shelter for their families. We are a country that supports the murder of babies. A baby born in the U.S. since 1980 is more likely to be killed than a WW II soldier who was in combat.

**REASON** #3 – All humanity is guilty and condemned because of God's Law . 3:19-20

In these two verses are three important stated purposes of the Law:

(Purpose #1) - The Law shuts mouths. 3:19a

(Purpose #2) - The Law establishes accountability . 3:19b

(Purpose #3) - The Law establishes <u>sin</u>. 3:20

One who wants to stand before God on the basis of his keeping of the Law had better understand that the Law is not designed to make us <u>right</u> with God. The Law is designed to show us we are <u>sinful</u> and <u>guilty</u> so we will totally rely upon Jesus Christ to save us. If we were to dare suggest that we have kept all of the Law of God, which is as righteous as God, God would shut our mouths with His Law .

Paul wanted every human to realize that before God he is guilty. If we will admit that and then totally trust in Jesus Christ to save us, we shall be saved.

God obviously knows what we really are, a bunch of depraved sinners. Why not say to God-you are absolutely right. I am a guilty sinner and that is why right now I place all of my faith in your Son, Jesus Christ, to save me from my terrible sins.
