### Imputed vs. Infused Righteousness

"Because Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God."

(1 Peter 3:18)

vangelic justification is not the work of the Spirit of God on the heart of the sinner, implanting life in, quickening the soul but the work of God as a Judge on the throne of justice, deciding on and adjudging one to life, according to law and justice. It is not the infusing of righteousness nor a purging out of the inward evils of the heart but the pronouncing of one's justification regarding the charge preferred against him. I wish the reader to understand distinctly that justification is an external act of God as Judge, acting in a court of justice, on the case of the sinner and not the internal work of the Spirit on the heart. God justifies the ungodly.

### **Unction from the Holy One** *"But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things..."*

(1 John 2:20)

he term **"unction"** is translated here as 'anointing' which John uses to remind his readers of the Spiritual anointing they have received from the Holy One: Christ. This anointing is not to be pursued as a separate experience after conversion but is already on them through Christ and His finished work at the cross. Let's explore the nature of this anointing:

- Primarily, 'anointing' relates to Christ Himself Whose title 'Christ' means 'the Anointed One' [Isaiah 61:1; Acts 4:27]. He was chosen and set apart by God the Father as Prophet, Priest and King: roles traditionally conferred through anointing in the Old Testament. In Christ, all these offices converge: He is the Prophet through Whom God speaks [Acts 3:22] the Priest Whose sacrifice justifies sinners [Hebrews 8:1] and the King to Whom all will bow, <u>Revelation 15:3</u>.
- Having an anointing from the Holy One means that believers share in the righteousness of Christ, imputed to them through His sacrificial death, <u>Romans 5:9-10</u>. Christ the Holy One, is the Foundation of their election, redemption, justification and sanctification [1 Corinthians 1:30] and through His completed work believers receive all Spiritual blessings, <u>Ephesians 1:3</u>.
- 3. Believers having this anointing 'know all things' not in the sense of lacking the need for instruction but because the Spirit of God reveals Christ in them, bringing understanding of their forgiveness and justification already accomplished at the cross through Him. They are contrasted with those

who reject Truth by following their own desires or false doctrines. Believers' anointing is rooted in their union with Christ: His death and resurrection are theirs and through God-given Faith they come to appreciate the blessings of this anointing bestowed by Grace. Christ is their complete satisfaction before the Father, leaving His chosen, redeemed children lacking in nothing.

In summary, the 'anointing' spoken of by John encompasses believers' union with Christ, their sharing in His righteousness imputed and the Spirit's work of revealing Christ's sufficiency in them for salvation. This passage emphasizes the centrality of Christ in the believers' experience and the completeness of their satisfaction in Him.

#### **Righteousness IMPUTED:**

t is the righteousness that is declared by God in the person of Christ and that which He alone accomplished in His life and death, that was then IMPUTED. A preacher, or anyone for that matter, who thinks that this is a minor doctrine is not of God.

- Righteousness imputed means Christ is the Doer and Perfecter of it.
- Righteousness imputed means God's justice fulfilled and wrath appeased (propitiated).
- Righteousness imputed means the grounds to bestow eternal life and blessing have been met to God's satisfaction.
- Righteousness imputed means that every jot and tittle of the law has been honored on behalf of the elect.
- Righteousness imputed means the glory of God is honored as all boasting is removed.
- Righteousness imputed exalts the Grace and Mercy towards the redeemed.
- Righteousness imputed means God stands as God...and it is free.
