

Unconquerable Love

Sermon 30 in the Romans Series

Romans 8:31-39

6 questions which challenge, lost men, human rulers, even the principalities and powers of spiritual wickedness in high places.

1. What shall we say to these things?
2. If (or since) God is for us, who can be against us?
3. He who did not spare His own Son...shall He not with him also freely give us all things?
4. Who can bring a charge against God's elect?
5. Who is he who condemns? (How can any since God has justified.)
6. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?

I. No One Can Fight Against God's Elect v. 31-32

v. 31 – “these things” refers to everything the Apostle has taught in the epistle.
Ultimately no one can fight against **us** because God is for us.

v. 32 -- God would have spared His son if it were not for us.
God would have removed the cup of wrath if it were not for us.
But Christ willingly took the cup so we would never have to.

He removed not the cup from Him, that it might never be presented to us!”

v.33 -- Who can lay a charge against God's elect?
God has declared those of us in Christ to be NOT GUILTY.

v. 34 -- If you can't even bring a legal accusation, you certainly can't condemn.

II. No One Can Separate God from His Elect v. 35-39

v.35-36 -- The love of Christ.
Not our love for Him, but His love for us.

Christ's love is changeless.
It is as changeless as God Himself.

36 – For Your sake – For God’s sake – for His cause. (psalm 44:22)

37 -- To say that we are conquerors is not enough.

We are hyper-conquerors.

We are super-conquerors.

We are MORE THAN conquerors.

38-39 -- I am persuaded, not “I think” or “I hope”.

I am absolutely convinced that...
