## Hebrews 6:19,20

## ASCENSION: ANCHOR OF OUR HOPE

- I. The anchor.
  - A. The history of Jesus' ascension.
  - B. "Hope" is a part of the Christian life, for we are born again unto a living hope (I Peter 1:3-5).
    - 1. To live forever in heavenly glory is "set before us" (18) as a future objective reality.
    - 2. The believers' hope is certain and sure for God Himself promised and He accompanied His promise with an oath (18).
    - 3. And it is an earnest desire that our expectation will be realized.
  - C. By the act of hoping (part of faith) in our hope the Christian is fastened to the object.
- II. Our anchor of hope holds.
  - A. The object of our hope is absolutely certain (because God promised and swore).
    - 1. It is "sure," i.e., certain and safe, reliable, it will not fail or deceive; can be safely trusted.
    - 2. It is "stedfast," i.e., stable and firm; it cannot be broken no matter how violent the winds of the storms.
  - B. Our hope is objectively certain because Jesus' ascension is His entering "into that within the veil."
    - 1. The veil (high, heavy, and thick) concealed the ark of the covenant (God) from His people.
    - 2. Jesus, the perfect High Priest, opened and realized the way to God, veil torn, never closed again.
  - C. This makes Jesus "the forerunner" when His ascension brought Him into the glory we will share with Him.
- III. Assurance that our hope will be realized is because God Himself promised and coupled it with His oath.
  - A. The storms of life seem to destroy us.
  - B. God makes sure that the anchor is firmly attached in the souls of every elect, regenerated child of His (3:6).
