Overcoming Evil With Good

1 Peter 3:9 Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.

- I. Not rendering or giving back, returning.
 - A. We are not to do unto others as they do unto us, but as we would that they do unto us.

Matthew 7:12 Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

- B. Our natural tendency is to give the evil back to them.
 - 1. So they will know what it feels like.
 - 2. Because they deserve it and they have it coming.
- C. Nobody believes in judging, but it is a pretty universal practice.
 - 1. Most everyone feels like they have the liberty, the wisdom, and the right to determine that other people have said or done wrong and what their punishment needs to be.
- D. This is the way of the world, and all the world behaves this way.
 - 1. The reaction to evil is evil.
 - 2. The reaction to railing is railing.
- E. But Christians are not of this world and their reactions are to be different because God has commanded so.
- II. Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing.
 - A. Evil means injury, harm, ill, bad.
 - B. The immediate carnal response is to dish it back to them.
 - 1. This is true for everyone, so no one may think themselves able to do otherwise because their temper is shorter than others.
 - 2. Everyone has the same inclination, but some are more self-disciplined than others and do not blow off immediately.
 - C. Railing means:
 - 1. Clamoring with insulting language; uttering reproachful words.
 - 2. Expressing reproach; insulting; as a railing accusation. 2 Peter 2.
 - 1. Words affect us almost like being smitten physically.
 - 2. We are quicker to strike back with words than we are with our fists.
 - 3. Many more people are skilled at railing with words than are skilled at fighting with their fists.
 - 4. It is not pleasing to God when we rail on others, or when we rail back on them for railing on us.
- III. But contrariwise blessing, knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.
 - A. Blessing: Making happy; wishing happiness to; praising or extolling; consecrating by prayer.
 - B. This is how a Christian is supposed to respond to evil and railing from others on himself.
 - C. Not swelled up with pride and returning evil for evil and railing for railing.

- D. But humbling ourselves under the might hand of God.
- IV. Now there is a promise given to us from God when we conduct ourselves in this matter the way He commands us to.

1 Peter 3:10 For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile:

- A. It is one of the most important keys to happiness in this earthly life not speaking evil.
- B. When you find someone who does not speak evil of others you will find a happy person.
- C. When you find a person who is habitually speaking evil of others you will find an unhappy and miserable person.
- D. The person who does not speak evil of others will be a peaceable person who is easy to get along with.

1 Peter 3:11 Let him eschew evil, and do good; let him seek peace, and ensue it.

Romans 14:19 Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another.

- 1. He will be one who does good and not evil to others.
- V. The Lord is on the side of those do righteousness and He is against those that do evil.

1 Peter 3:12 For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil.

- A. God is always watching the righteous and his ears are always open to their prayers.
- B. But God has his face against them that do evil.
 - 1. Those who do evil and rail on others have God as their enemy.

Romans 12:19 Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.

- 2. When we take vengeance ourselves we are jumping in front of God He wants to do it himself.
- C. Our vengeance only makes folks more angry and offended and determined to get even with us again.
- D. When God judges evil it works much more effectively.
- E. So God's way is for us to do good to others even when they do evil to us.

Romans 12:20-21 Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.

- 1. This is the way we can overcome evil.
- VI. We will just be much better off if we will only listen to God's counsel here.

1 Peter 3:13-14 And who is he that will harm you, if ye be followers of that which is good? But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye: and be not afraid of their terror, neither be troubled;

- A. By refraining from doing evil and always doing good to others we lessen the chances that they would want to hurt us.
- B. But if we do suffer for doing good we still have happiness as our reward here and now.
- C. And we have no reason to fear because we know God is watching and listening and He will judge the wicked and care for his own.
