English Standard Version - Acts 1:1-11

1 In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, 2 until the day when He was taken up, after He had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom He had chosen. 3 He presented himself alive to them after His suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

4 And while staying with them He ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, He said, "you heard from Me; 5 for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

6 So when they had come together, they asked Him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" 7 He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by His own authority. 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." 9 And when He had said these things, as they were looking on, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight. 10 And while they were gazing into heaven as He went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, 11 and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw Him go into heaven."

- Happy Easter! Easter is far too important to keep to just one day, so at Metrocrest we celebrate Easter for a whole season. From Easter until Pentecost—a total of fifty days—we join Christians around the world in reflecting on the meaning of Christ's resurrection.
- 2. **Serving Today:** The scheduled Service Leader this morning is James Woods. The scheduled Prayer Leader is Larry Perry.
- 3. **Holy Communion:** It's the Second Sunday of the month, so we will share the Lord's Supper this morning. <u>All</u> baptized persons who worship the Lord Jesus Christ and are in communion with His church are welcome to receive. Please come forward as directed. We offer both grape juice and, in the outer ring of each tray, in tinted cups, wine. Please take the elements to your seat and wait to consume them until we do so together. Please dispose of cups at the back of the church at the end of the service.
- 4. Happy Mother's Day! To every mom here today, we thank God for you and wish you a day filled with love and joy! For the moms who are not here today, including those who are now with Jesus, we thank God for them too and for all they did to help us and support us. For those who are alienated from their moms, we pray for healing and reconciliation. For those who have not had children, or have had fertility issues, we pray for peace and comfort—and for miracles. And for those who never really knew the love of a mother, we pray that Jesus' perfect love will fill in where others have fallen short.
- 5. Service Changes: We are making a few changes to our worship service. Most will probably be invisible to you, involving the rotation of different prayers in the bulletin, but a few changes will likely get your attention. For instance, we will start saying the Nice Creed on Communion Sundays (like today); and, as what we hope will be a temporary cost-cutting measure, we have started printing the bulletin in black and white.
- 6. Called Prayer Meeting: Please join us after church today to pray for the families of the victims of the shootings last weekend in Allen, for the community of Allen, and especially for the family of Laura Stites, our church's administrative assistant who lives there.

- 8. **Prayer with the Pastor:** If you have something you'd like to pray about this morning, please speak to Pastor Bill Lovell. He will be happy to make arrangements.
