Debate: Wives of deacons or female deacons? (continued)

An Important Question: Does the office of deacon possess an authority that Paul has prohibited for women in the church?

- 1 Timothy 2:12 (ESV) I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man...
 - Prohibits not only teaching, also exercising authority over a man (very general)
- The diaconate seems to possess a kind of pastoral authority
 - The word itself implies authority (Διακόνος)
 - The office exercises delegated pastoral authority
 - o Deacons commonly exercise authority in their duties
- The flow of 1 Timothy 3 also seems to rule against female deacons

Another Debate: Husband of one wife (12a; lit. "one woman men" μιᾶς γυναικὸς ἄνδρες,)

- No polygamists allowed (doubtful)
- Marriage is required (No bachelors allowed)
 - o Cf. 1 Cor 7:32-35, Matt 19:12
- No remarriage allowed (only one wife ever)
 - Biblical divorce: Matt. 5:32; 19:9; 1 Cor. 7:15
 - o Biblical remarriage: 1 Cor. 7:9, 39; Rom. 7:2–3

• "One woman type of man" (marital fidelity/chastity)

Managing their children and their own households well (12b)

The promise: Good standing and great confidence in the faith (13)

Can a man's past disqualify him from office?

- What are these qualifications?
- Seeking balance between reality and repentance (1 Cor 6:9-11)
