	They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer Acts 2:42

Th	he Gospel: What is the Gospel of the King and the Kingdom?
	God <u>sent</u> His Son, Jesus the God-Man, to save us from sin and satisfy us in God forever. – John 3:16
	Jesus \underline{lived} the life we could never live (a life of perfect obedience/ love). – Romans 5:19
	Jesus <u>died</u> the death we deserve to die (the just wrath of God on the cross) 1 Peter 3:18
	Jesus <u>rose</u> from the dead as an able and willing Savior to offer forgiveness, the Holy Spirit and eternal life to all. – Luke 24:45-47
	Jesus \underline{reigns} over all things as sovereign Lord and King for the good of His people and the glory of God and He sent His Spirit to bring people into His kingdom. – $Acts~17:6-7$

	☐ The New Testament often summarizes our proper response to the Good News as simply faith. – Acts 16:30-31; Ephesians 2:8-9; Romans 3:28

	□ Sometimes the New Testament summarizes our proper response to the Good News as simply repentance. – Acts 2:37-38; Matthew 4:17; Acts 17:30-31		
	□ Sometimes the New Testament summarizes our proper response to the Good News as a combination of repentance and faith. – Acts 20:21; Mark 1:14-15		
Why does the New Testament talk like this?			
<i>Turn</i> and <i>Trust</i> are two sides of the same coin of a <i>humble response</i> to God in light of our sin. – Luke 18:9-14; Acts 11:21			
	st and <i>Hope</i> are two sides of the same coin side of <i>Trust</i> . If we have savingly <i>Trusted</i> , then we ll <i>Rest</i> and <i>Hope</i> .		
Love and Endure are two sides of the same coin side of Turn. If we have savingly Turned, then we will Love and Endure.			
	<u>Turn</u> from sin to God for mercy to be set free from the penalty and power of sin (repentance). – Acts 2:37-38; Acts 26:20; Acts 15:19; Luke 15:11-32		
	<u>Trust</u> in Jesus as Lord and Savior for your acceptance with God (faith). – John 1:11-13; Luke 23:39-43		
	<u>Rest</u> in Jesus for God the Father's full and lasting love through (faith in) His pardon and perfection. – 1 John 4:14-16; Galatians 4:9; Mark 4:35-41).		
	<u>Hope</u> in God for the promises of help (power and provision) and happiness (full and lasting joy) because of Jesus. – Acts 14:15; 1 Thessalonians 1:9-10; John 15:7-11; Hebrews 11:8-16).		
	<u>Love</u> in submission to God's Word and will with God's people by His Spirit to be like Jesus. – 1 John 5:2-3; 1 Peter 3:11; James 2:14-26; Genesis 22:1-19		
	<u>Endure</u> faithfully in the face of suffering (pain) and seduction (pleasures) like Jesus who endured the cross for the joy set before Him. – Luke 8:13-15; James 5:7-11; Job 2:1-10
