

Warding off:

I. Disappointment – "keep unto thee the covenant" (vs.12-13)

Remembering we are:

- A. Beloved "And He will love thee, and bless thee"
- **B.** Blessed "will bless the fruit of thy womb and...thy land"
- C. Beneficiaries "the land which He sware to thy fathers"

II. Disease —"will take away from thee all sickness" (vs. 14-16)

Remembering we have:

- A. Favor "Thou shall be blessed above all people"
- **B.** Family -"shall not be male or female barren among you"
- C. Forgiveness "will put none of the evil diseases ... upon you"

III. Doubts — "how can I dispossess them" (vs. 17-18)

Remembering not to:

- A. Fret "say in thy heart, these nations are more than I"
- **B.** Fear "Thou shall not be afraid of them
- C. Forget "remember what the Lord thy God did to Pharoah"

Sentence Sermon

"Just as fear can tear down your spiritual immunity, faith in God's goodness will build it up."
