Theme: The Living God is not tied to a temple of stone; nor is His Church. He is with His people wherever they go – on earth and in heaven.

Introduction: Some things are worth dying for.

I. The Servant – Stephen shares in Christ's Power, Wisdom, Suffering & Peace

II. The Opposition

- A. Synagogue of the Freedmen
- B. Their charge
 - 1. Serious two-fold charge nothing more sacred or precious to Jews than the temple and their law.
 - 2. Is Stephen speaking against the temple and the Law??
 - False witnesses charge v. 14
 - Stephen's teaching was that of Jesus.
 - 3. Jesus on the temple and the law.
 - a. He would replace the temple (John 2:19-21)
 - He was the new temple replacing the old!
 - "One greater than the temple is here!" (Mt.12:6)
 - b. He would *fulfill* the law.
 - Accused of disrespect for the law (broke Sabbath regulations ate with sinners let his disciples pick grain on the Sabbath)
 - Came not to abolish the law or the Prophets, but to fulfill them. (Matthew 5:17)

III. The Message -

- A. A unique message for Acts
 - longest sermon/address in Acts by far
 - Ends *not* with call to repentance but with OT-style condemnation
- B. A unique lesson in Israel's history
 - 1. God's presence with his people is not tied to the temple.
 - a. Abraham? (2-8) The *God of Glory* comes to him *in Meso-potamia!* Here God revealed himself in a foreign land! To a man who worshipped foreign gods (Joshua 24:2). NOTE: *Long before there was any temple, any meeting "place" God had a holy people who were his own. The promise was renewed many times.*
 - b. Joseph. (9-16) 6 times in 7 verses we are reminded that God was with His servant in Egypt! God rescued him God was with him.
 - c. Moses raised up to deliver the people. (17-43) NOTE: Divides this section into three 40 yr. periods.

- Time of promise grows near! v17
- God appears in Burning Bush!! He must *remove his sandals* because he was *on Holy ground!!*
- Israelites rejected Moses—but God appointed him as ruler and redeemer! (35)
- 36,37?? Foretold the coming of the messiah as a prophet like him!
- d. David & Solomon (44-50)
 - Temple may be symbol of His presence among the people but... (49,50!)
 - It could never be regarded as God's Home in any literal sense. (48!!)
 - 2 Chronicles 6:18; Isaiah 66:1,2

NOTE: Stephen has proven that: If God has a home on earth – it is with his people! He will be their God, and where they are, He will be.

- 2. Having the Law and Keeping the Law are two different matters.
 - a. Jesus *fulfilled* the law. Matthew 5:17
 - b. His accusers have rejected the Word of God Not Stephen!
 - They killed the one predicted to come The Righteous One!
 - rejected the Law did not obey it!
- IV. The Rejection Swift and violent.

V. The Mission

A. For Stephen? Mission complete.

1. Lays theological groundwork for Kingdom Expansion

- Frees the church from the temple!
- It has always been the case. God never "attached" to it.
- 2. Receives his heavenly reward!
- B. The Church?

1. Kingdom Expansion - Phase I

- Physically Driven Out from Jerusalem!
- Message (and messengers) go to Judea and Samaria.
- 2. Many will receive their heavenly reward!

Conclusion:

- 1. We don't, you don't have a corner on the market! God can save, deliver, redeem *anyone He pleases!*
- 2. The message? God has taken up residence in His people! Is it worth dying for?? Will we die to self to see it spread??
